Chapter 1

Introducing Logiscope Studio

Logiscope **Studio** is an environment tool to build and visualize the results produced by the IBM® Rational® Logiscope™ toolset including *CodeReducer*, *QualityChecker*, *RuleChecker* or *TestChecker* verification modules for application written in Ada, C, C++, or Java.


Logiscope **Studio** is a multi-view tool, it can show source files as well as metrics values, rule violations or test coverage.

- the **Workspace View** displays the **File View** including Logiscope project files,
- the **Result Pane** displays various windows (source files, html reports, ...),
- the **Output Window** displays project messages, error messages, warnings or results.

These views are presented in detail in the following chapter.

Logiscope **Studio** is a context-sensitive graphical tool. It is consistent and intuitive in its design with palettes, menus, standard “drag and drop” features, as well as undo/redo.

On line context-sensitive help is available by using the Help icon or the F1 key

- to obtain help on the toolbar buttons, click the **Help** icon  then click on the desired button;
- to get help on the pop-up menu commands, position the cursor on the desired command then press the <F1> key;
- to get help on menus or areas, use one of the above.

Submitting problems

Severity	Description

3	The problem has <i>some</i> business impact. The program is usable, but less significant features (not critical to operation) are unavailable.
4	The problem has a <i>minimal</i> business impact. The problem causes little impact on operations or a reasonable circumvention to the problem was implemented.

2. Describe your problem and gather background information, When describing a problem to IBM, be as specific as possible. Include all relevant background information so that IBM Rational Software Support specialists can help you solve the problem efficiently. To save time, know the answers to these questions:
 - What software versions were you running when the problem occurred?
To determine the exact product name and version, use the option applicable to you:
 - Start the IBM Installation Manager and select **File > View Installed Packages**. Expand a package group and select a package to see the package name and version number.
 - Start your product, and click **Help > About** to see the offering name and version number.
 - What is your operating system and version number (including any service packs or patches)?
 - Do you have logs, traces, and messages that are related to the problem symptoms?
 - Can you recreate the problem? If so, what steps do you perform to recreate the problem?

Chapter 2

Studio Interface

2.1 Starting up Studio

To start up Studio do one of the following:

On Windows:

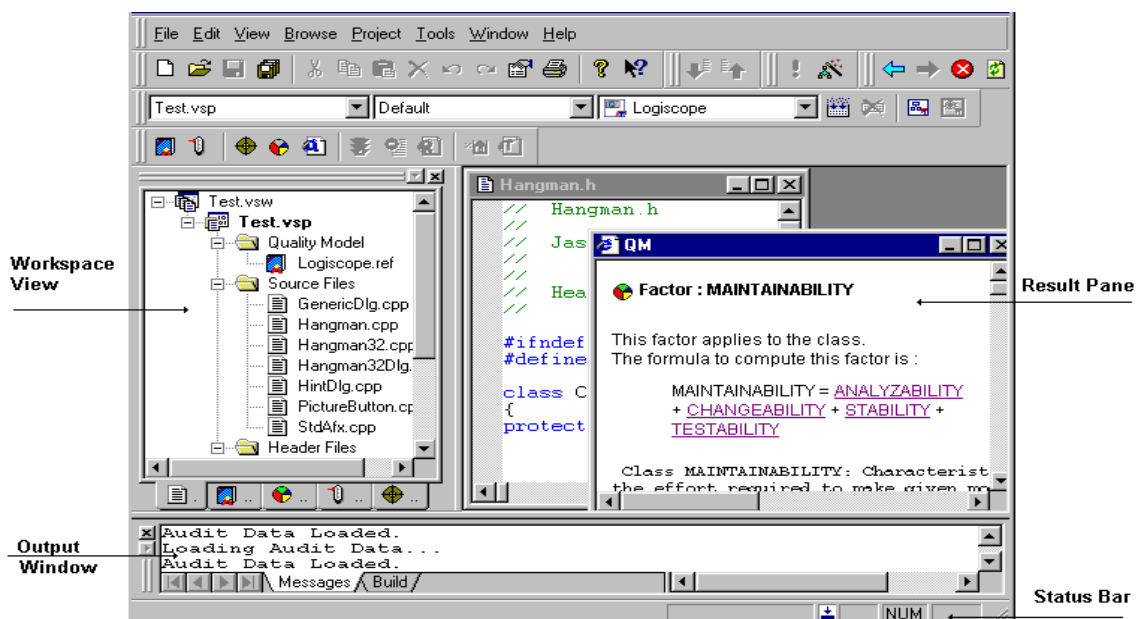
- open the **Start** menu and select **Programs - IBM Rational - IBM Rational Logiscope <version>**, or
- in Windows Explorer, double-click a **.ttp** or **.ttw** file.

On UNIX:

- launch **ves** binary.

2.2 Overview of Studio Windows

The picture below represents Logiscope Studio main windows:



Description of Studio different windows:

Workspace View

The **Workspace View** displays the **File View** (main tab) with the project files: the quality model file, source and header files, rule files and dynamic files. A double click on any item displays it in the result pane.

This window is used to display any information related to the project including:

- the **File View** tab,
- the **Quality** tab,
- the **Dictionary** tab,
- the **Criteria** tab,
- the **Factors** tab,
- the **Metrics Values** tab,
- the **User Request** tab,
- the **Violations** tab,
- the **File Violations** tab,
- the **Components** tab,
- the **Tests** tab.

Result Pane

Displays various result windows: source files, html reports...



Output Window

Displays messages and information on the project. It contains the **Messages**, **Build**, **Browse** and **Script** tabs used to show warnings, error messages and results.

- the **Messages** tab is used to give information on the project loading.
- the **Build** tab is used to display the analysis results.
- the **Browse** tab is used to visualize metrics, rules or test information.
- the **Script** tab is used to view the Tcl execution results.

Status Bar

A display area for:

- help on toolbars buttons,
- location (Ln x, Col y) in the active window from result pane,
- the tool execution status: when running, the indicator is , otherwise it is .

*Note: Status bar can be displayed or hidden by checking or clearing the **Display status bar** choice in the Editor tab of **Tools - Options** command.*

Menu bar

The **Menu bar** includes available pull-down menus. Click a name to open the menu and access the associated commands.



Here is a short description of these menus:

File	contains project and file commands
<i>Note: Recent Files or Recent Workspaces last used can be opened by selecting the filename or the workspace from the File menu.</i>	
Edit	contains editing commands
View	contains commands to customize Studio window
Browse	allows to display to different views of the project
Project	contains commands to update and customize the project
Tools	contains commands to customize tools, toolbars and options
Window	contains commands to arrange multiple windows
Help	contains online help commands

All commands are fully described in Chapter 3.

Note: Menu bar can be displayed or hidden by checking or clearing itself in other toolbar pop-up menu.

Toolbars

Toolbars provide shortcuts for some of the most common commands. Icons are grayed out when they are not active.

Each toolbar is displayed at a default location or at the last location.

Displaying or hiding a toolbar:

A toolbar can be displayed or hidden by checking or clearing in one of the following way:

- its name in the pop-up menu of any toolbar
- the **Hide** option in its own pop-up menu (except for Menu bar)
- its name in the **Toolbars** tab of **Tools - Customize** command (except for Menu bar)
- its name in **View** command (only for Standard toolbar)

Moving a toolbar:

Point to the toolbar title bar and drag it to the desired location.

Customizing a toolbar:

Customize a toolbar by removing unwanted buttons or adding new buttons, menus or commands with the **Tools - Customize** command.

Restoring a default toolbar:

Use the **Reset** button in the **Toolbars** tab of the **Tools - Customize** command.

Note: A custom toolbar cannot be reset.

Project Bar







The **Project Bar** contains three drop-down lists to set up the active project, its configuration and the tool. It also includes four buttons corresponding to commands of the active tool.

*Note: The active project can be set with a right click on a project in the **File View** and choose the **Set as Active Project** option.*

A configuration shows the tool active options. It is defined via the **Settings... - Project menu** command.

Currently, tools available in the Logiscope environment are Logiscope *Viewer* and Logiscope *TestChecker*.

- **Build**  to generate and build the project. If the project has already been built, this will only rebuild what has changed.
- **Stop**  to stop the building process
- **Rebuild all**  to generate and build the project. This will force a rebuild of the entire project.
- **Start Viewer**  to launch **Viewer** (available if the *QualityChecker* and *TestChecker* modules have been activated).

- **Start TestChecker**  to launch **TestChecker** (available if the *TestChecker* modules have been activated).

*Note: To launch these commands, a project must be loaded in the **File View**.*

Logiscope Bar



Allows to show specific results for the current project. From left to right, symbols allow to:

- display the **Metrics Dictionary**
- display the **Criteria Level**
- display the **Factor Level**
- generate the HTML **Quality Report** and open it
- display the **Rule Violations**
- display the **Rule Violation List**
- generate the HTML **Rule Violation Report** and open it
- display the **Component Coverage**
- generate the HTML **Test Report** and open it

*Note: Items are available depending on the module activated for the current project, i.e. *QualityChecker*, *RuleChecker*, *CodeReducer* or *TestChecker*.*

To Shortcut Logiscope bar:

Click right on Logiscope toolbar and choose **To shortcut** command from the pop-up menu. The toolbar appears in the shortcut palette:



To reinstall the commands in the toolbar, click right in the shortcut palette (once the shortcut bar structure is developed) and choose the **As Toolbar** command from the pop-up menu. The toolbar will go back to its initial location.

Standard Bar



The **Standard bar** provides shortcuts for most commonly used commands of File and Edit menus.

From left to right respectively, symbols allow to:

- create a new project or workspace
- open an existing file
- save the active file
- save all files
- cut the selection
- copy the selection
- paste the selection
- delete the selection
- undo
- redo
- edit properties
- print the active file
- help on Studio
- help on specific topics

Note: Items are available depending on the context.

Browse Bar



Provides a navigation tool in the **Browse** tab of the output window. From left to right respectively, symbols allow to:

- select next item
- select previous item

TCL Script Bar



Allows navigation in Logiscope internal data. From left to right respectively symbols allow to:

- execute the **Tcl Script**
- open the **Tcl Script Wizard**

Mini Web Bar



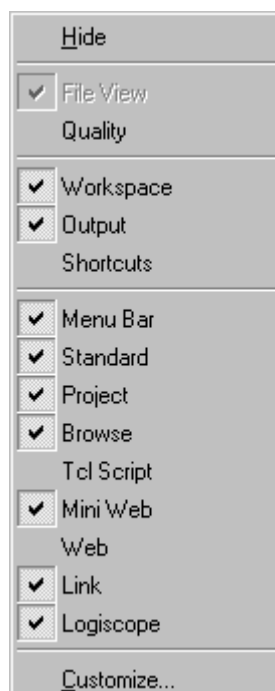
Allows navigation in HTML documents and internal data.

From left to right respectively symbols allow to:

- go back to previous page
- go to next page
- stop the page loading
- refresh the current display
- go to the home page

Note:

For all the tabs displayed in the Workspace View and all the bars previously described, a contextual pop-up menu can be activated to hide, show or customize tabs or bars.



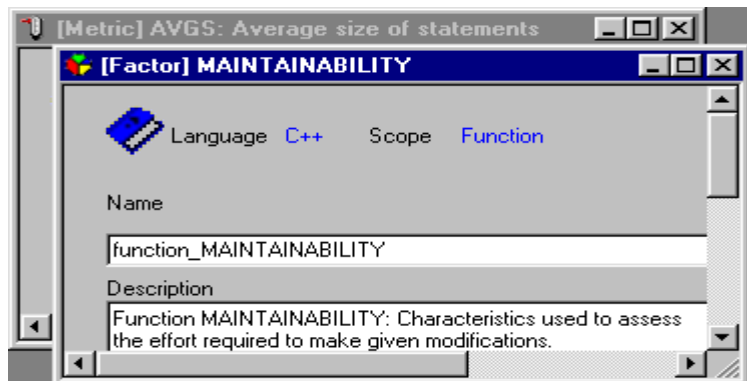
2.2.1 Managing Studio Windows

Several files can be opened at the same time.

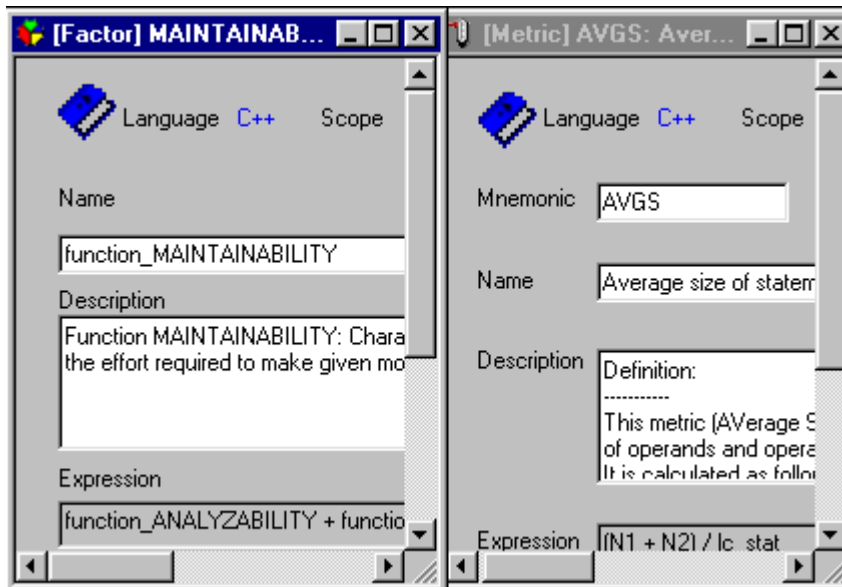
The windows display mode can be modified. In the **Window** menu, three Studio operating modes are possible for window management. By default, the windows opened are displayed in cascade.

Modify the display mode by choosing either **Cascade** or **Tile** display:

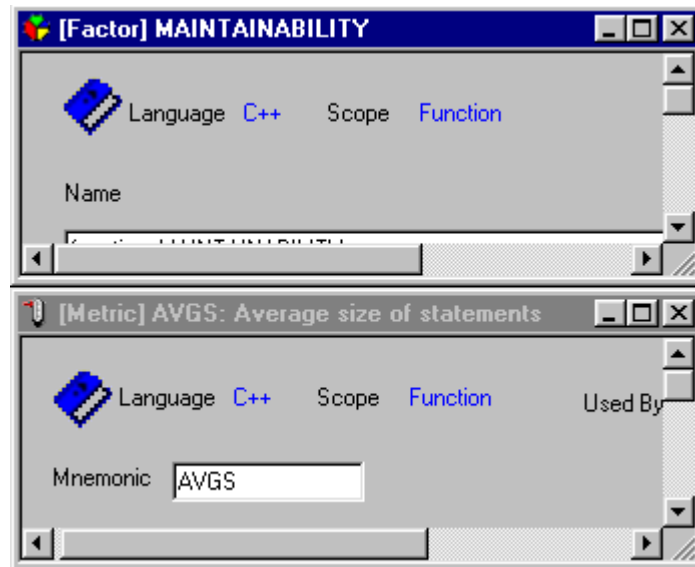
- select **Cascade** or **Tile** option in the **Window** menu.
The **Cascade** mode is as follows:



The **Tile Vertically** mode is as follows:



The **Tile Horizontally** mode is as follows:



A window can also be duplicated:

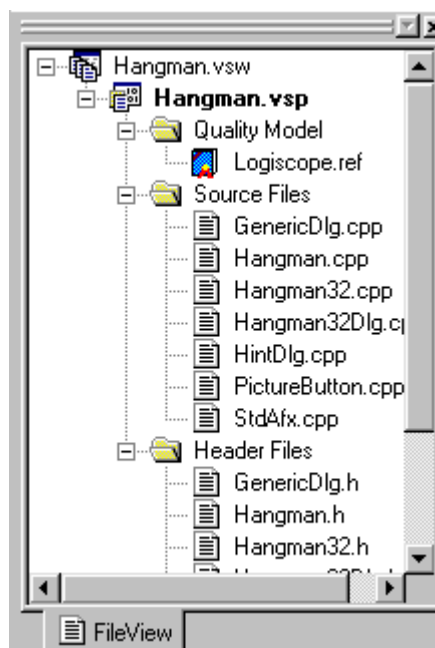
- Select the **New Window** command in the **Window** menu.
The screen now contains two windows, each containing the same file.
- The windows can be closed individually with the **Windows-Close** command or all at once, **Close All** or with the **File - Close** command.

2.3 File View (Tab)

The **File View** displays a workspace, one or more projects grouped in this workspace and all files referenced by each project depending on its type (*QualityChecker*, *RuleChecker*, *Codereducer* or *TestChecker*).

For easier visualization, the **File View** shows entities assembled by category in folders. In each category, entities are displayed in alphabetical order.

In the following example the Hangman project (**Hangman.ttp**) is included in the Hangman workspace (**Hangman.ttw**) with a quality model file (**Logiscope.ref**). Source and header files of the project are also displayed as mentioned above.



The **File View** content can be expanded (respectively collapsed) into parts:

- to expand (collapse) an item, click its preceding + (-) symbol or
- use the arrow keys or
- double-click on a folder
- to expand the whole **File View** content, use the star (*) key of the numeric pad.

To access an item, select it directly with the mouse or use the arrow keys to navigate in the view; or type the first letter of its name (the item will be found and automatically selected).

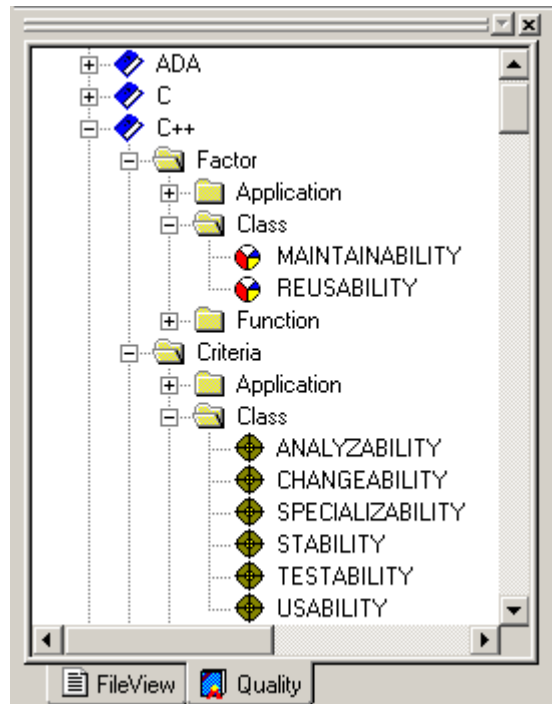
The **File View** main purpose is managing files in a Logiscope project. It allows to:

- display the Logiscope project file list,
- edit the workspace and project(s), i.e.:
 - n display or edit (only for a project) their properties: select a workspace or project and click the **Properties** icon, or right-click and choose the **Properties** option from the pop-up menu, or use the **Properties - View menu** command,

- n add files (see the **Add To Project - Files - Project menu** command),
- n remove files by using **Cut - Edit menu** or **Delete - Edit menu** command,
- n organize the file presentation by using folders: add a new folder by using the **Add To Project - New Folder - Project menu** command; move a file from a folder to another by using the drag and drop mechanism (note that the appearance of the cursor changes depending on whether it points to an authorized or unauthorized location),
- manage the project settings (see the **Settings... - Project menu** command for more details),
- visualize Logiscope file references via the **Properties** dialog (for more details, see the **Properties - View menu** command).

2.4 Quality (Tab)

This function allows to read the quality model definition (metrics, criteria and factors used with their limits) according to Ada, C, C++ or Java languages. It is only available for *QualityChecker* projects.



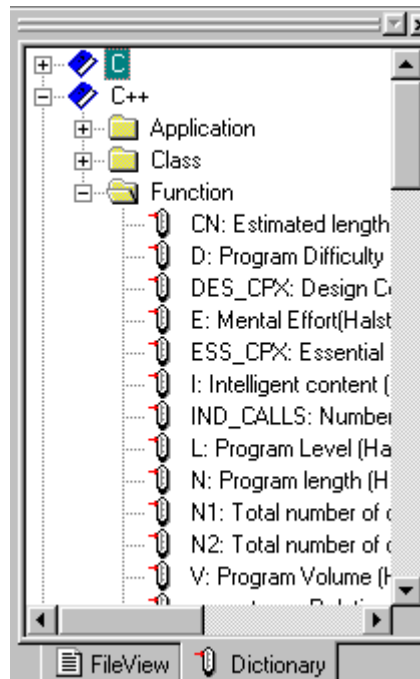
Double click an item (factor, criterion or metric), an html window displays its definition in the result pane.

2.5 Dictionary (Tab)

All available metrics definitions appear for each language (C, C++, Ada and Java). Double click a metric to get its corresponding description in the result pane.

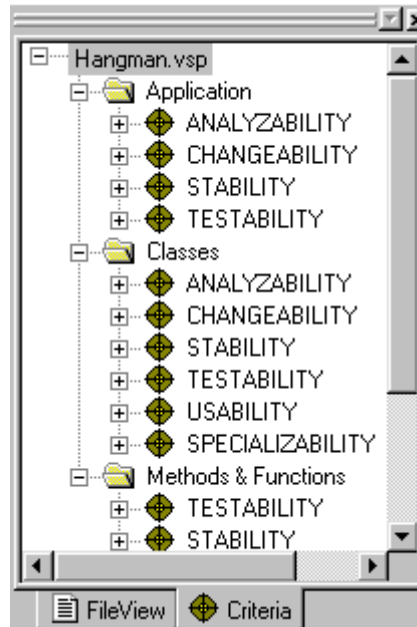
It is always available.

All these metrics can be used to determine calculated metrics or criteria in the Quality Model.




2.6 Criteria (Tab)

The **Criteria** tab displays components sorted by evaluation degree for each criterion. It is only available for *QualityChecker* projects.

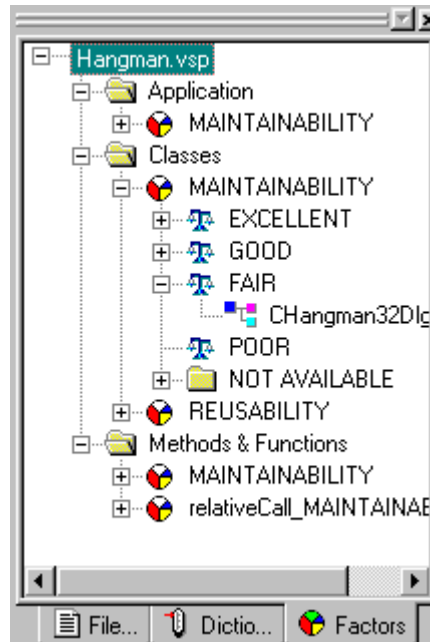


It allows to:

- Expand any criterion to get the analysis results with its evaluation degree : EXCELLENT, GOOD, FAIR or POOR.
- Expand each evaluation degree to show components, classes or application belonging to that degree.
- Double click a criterion to get the corresponding html definition window with links to criterion composition and metrics definition.
- Double click a component or a class to display its code in the result pane and its metrics value in the output window (**Browse** tab).
- Double click a metric to get its definition in the result pane.

2.7 Factors (Tab)

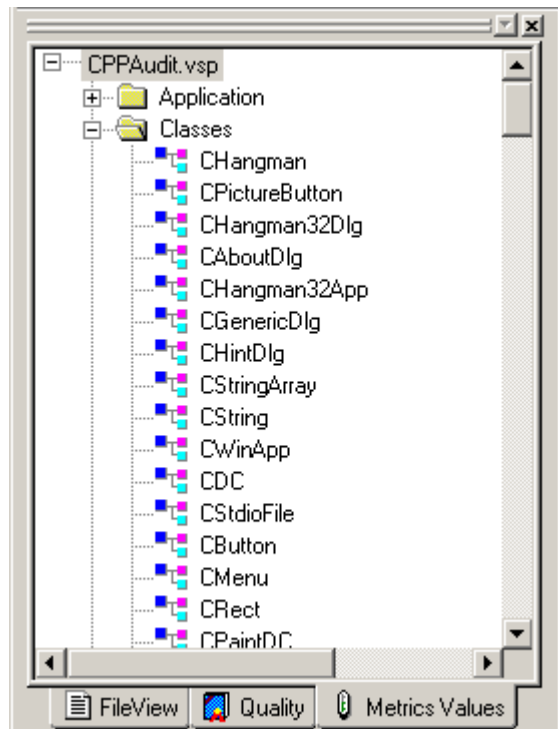
The **Factors** tab offers the same possibilities as **Criteria**: see paragraph 2.6. It is only available for *QualityChecker* projects.



2.8 Metrics Values (Tab)

Displays the computed basic metrics values according to application, classes, methods & functions, depending on the type of the project. It is always available.

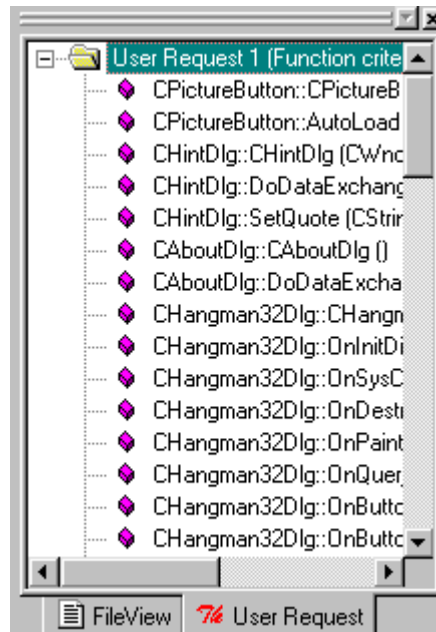
A double click on an application, a class or a method/function opens an html table in the result pane with the corresponding basic metric names and values.



2.9 User Request (Tab)

The **User Request** tab displays for the current project the list of classes or methods/functions for the chosen criterion or factor evaluation degree. It is only available for *QualityChecker* projects.

A double click on any item will display the source file window and shows its metric values in the output window.



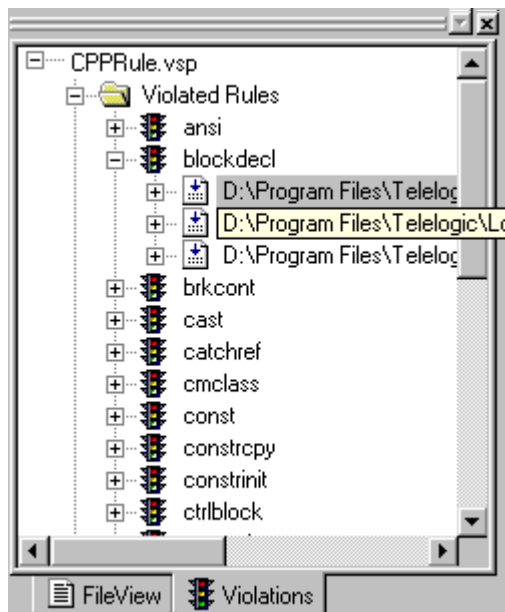
*Note: It is possible to make multiple requests by adding them in the **User Request** tab or by creating a new tab.*

2.10 Violations (Tab)

Displays the violated, clean (not violated) and ignored rules for the current project. A double click on a rule opens its description in html format in the result pane.

It is only available for *RuleChecker* projects.

A double click on a violated line opens the corresponding source file and highlights the violation.

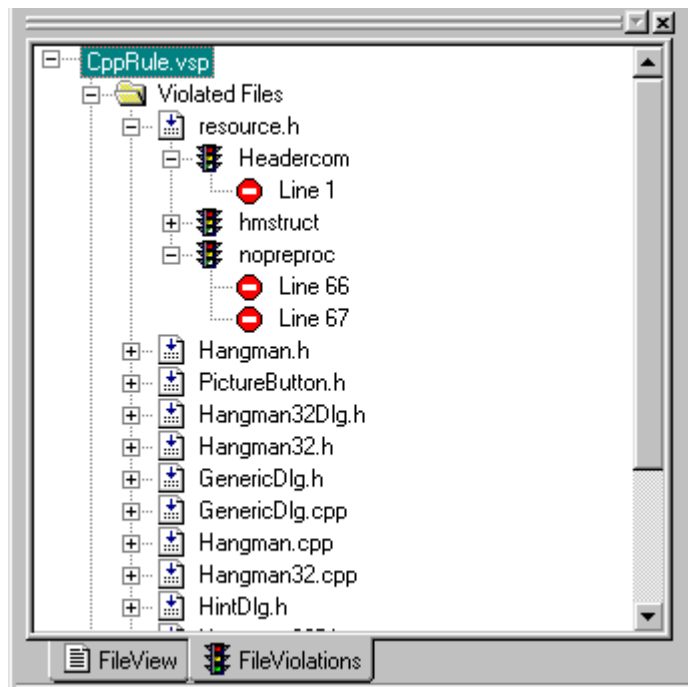


2.11 File Violations (Tab)

It displays the files in the current project where the violations occurred. It is only available for *RuleChecker* projects.

A double click on a rule opens its description in the result pane.

A double click on a violated line opens the corresponding source file and highlights the violation.

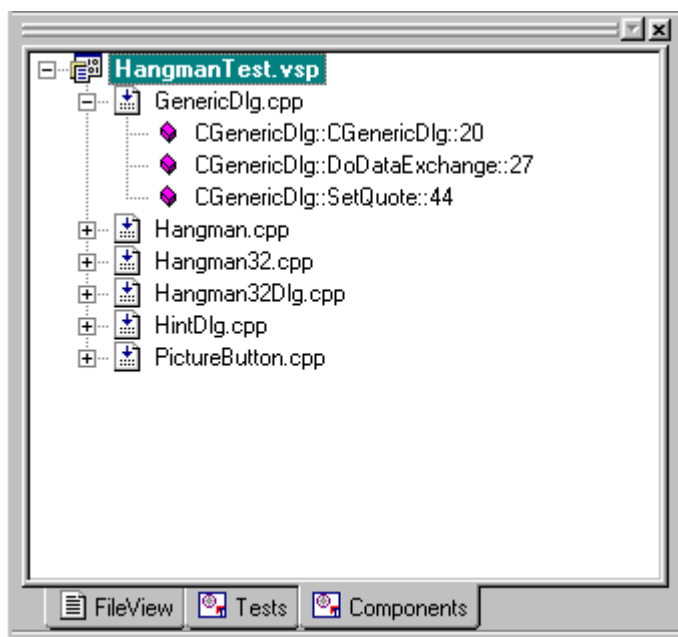


2.12 Components (Tab)

It displays components sorted by source files in the current project. It is only available for *TestChecker* projects.

A double click on a file opens a Component window in the result pane, with DDP and MCDC coverage rate for each component in this file.

A double click on a component opens a Test window in the result pane, with DDP coverage, DDP improvement, MCDC coverage, MCDC improvement, comment and status for each test.

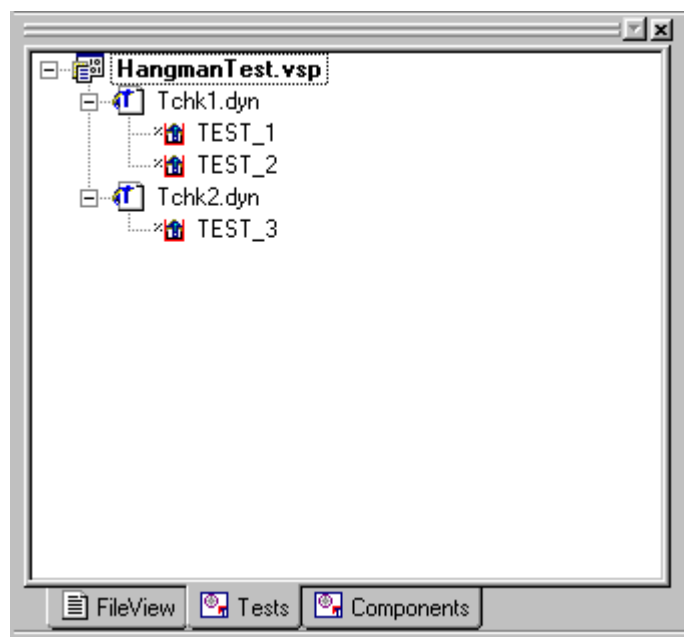


2.13 Tests (Tab)

It displays tests sorted by dynamic files in the current project. It is only available for *TestChecker* projects.

A double click on a dynamic file opens a Test window in the result pane, with DDP coverage, DDP improvement, MCDC coverage, MCDC improvement, comment and status for each test in this file.


A double click on a test opens a Component window in the result pane, with DDP and MCDC coverage rate for each component.



2.14 Browse (Tab)

This tab is an Excel table displaying textual results, that may be saved in an Excel file using the **Save As** pop-up menu. It is used for all types of projects (*QualityChecker*, *RuleChecker*, *CodeReducer* and *TestChecker*).

A double click on a metric or a selection and activating **Locate** pop-up menu opens its description in html format in the result pane.



A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

2.15 Script (Tab)

It is used to print the a messages in the output window when the **Script** is executing a Tcl command.

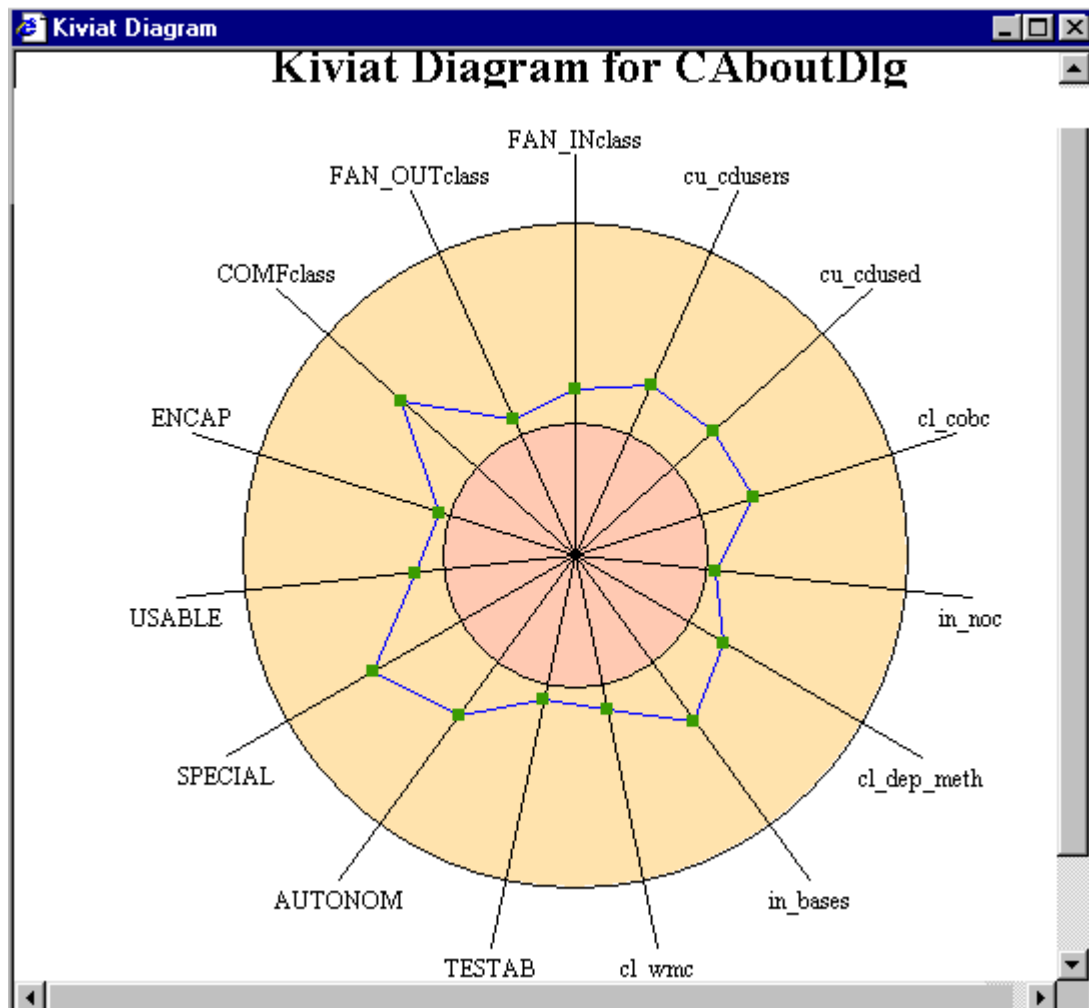

2.16 Kiviatic Graph (only on Windows)

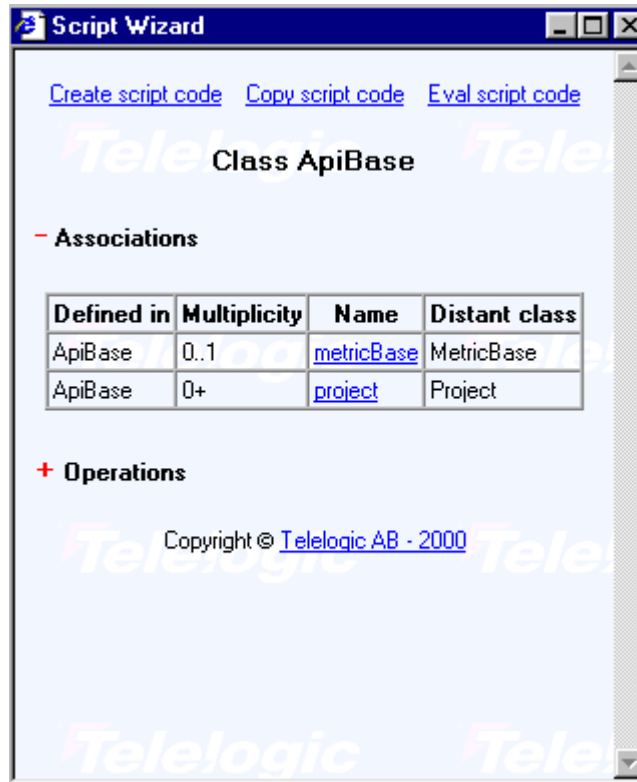
The **Kiviatic Graph** is a representation of all metrics values. The outer circle symbolizes upper bounds and the inner circle symbolizes lower bounds. It is available for a component at criterion and factor level.

It is only available for *QualityChecker* projects.




2.17 Script Wizard


The **Script Wizard** can be opened by clicking the script wizard button  of the Tcl script toolbar. It allows to navigate in the UML representation of a Logiscope project and to create Tcl scripts to extract information from the project.



The UML metamodel describes the project structure and Logiscope entities (see the description in [Appendix A](#)). The **Mini Web** toolbar allows to navigate in the UML model.

To consult Logiscope data, simply navigate in the UML metamodel and click on **Eval script code** (always displayed at the top of the page): the data are displayed in the **Browse** tab of the output window or in the **Script** tab for textual information.

The **Browse** toolbar  allows to navigate up and down in the **Browse** tab and to open the view associated to each item.

The navigation and the resulting model query can be stored in a Tcl script by using the **Create script code** option (always displayed at the top of the page): a Tcl view displays the script. Execute it by using the **Execute script** button  of the Tcl script toolbar; save it by using the **Save - File menu** or **Save As - File menu** command. To simply copy it, use the **Copy script code** option (always displayed at the top of the page): then paste it in another script or document.

Use Tcl scripts to create another parameterizable view and display it in the **Framework View**. To create such a script, use the **Create script code** option as described previously, then use one of the following functions in it:

BrowserReportInit tabName [iconFile] [-keep] [-cb tclFile]: this command allows to activate a tree tab inside the framework. If needed the tab is created. If iconFile is present, then the icon will be used as the tab image. If keep is present then the contents of the tab (if any) are kept, otherwise the tab is reset. If the -cb tclFile is present, then the associated Tcl script will be evaluated when a double click on a tree object occurs and the OnDoubleClick proc of this Tcl script will be called with double clicked object as parameter.

BrowserReport [-expanded] identObj [parentObj]: this command is used to add a new object in the tree. If -expanded is present and if the object has children, then the node will be expanded, otherwise it will be collapsed. If parentObj is present the node is created as a child of the node corresponding to parentObj.

ReportInit [-check] [-cb tclfile] [column-label column-width column-alignment]+: This command is used to create a new report tab in the output window. If the -check is used, a check box is displayed before each result line. These check boxes allow a more powerful navigation: only the checked lines will be selected when navigating with the F4 key, others are ignored. If the -cb tclFile is present, then the associated Tcl script will be evaluated when a double click on a line object occurs and the OnDoubleClick proc of this Tcl script will be called with double clicked object as parameter. For each column-label column-width column-alignment a new column is created with the corresponding label, width and alignment. An alignment of 0 means left align and an alignment of 1 means right. For sorting, columns right aligned are considered as number and columns left aligned are considered as text.


Report sourceObject [label]*: this command is used for adding new lines in a report tab. The sourceObject will be used to fill the first column (icon + text) automatically. The labels, are used to fill the remaining columns.

Output msg: this command allows Tcl script to print a message in the Tcl output tab.

Note: See [Appendix A](#) for more details.

2.18 Textual View

Displays the content of a textual file (source code, quality model, rule set, dynamic execution file).

The programming language keywords appear in a different color than the rest of the words in order to make reading easier.

Example: green for comments, blue for keywords, purple for strings and black as the default color.

The line and column for the cursor position are indicated to the right of the **Status bar**

A **Textual View** allows to:

- consult a textual file content,
- edit a textual file content; several functionalities facilitate its edition:
 - n type new text or change an existing one,
 - n find: to quickly locate character strings (see the **Find - Edit menu** command),
 - n replace: to find and replace character strings (see the **Replace - Edit menu** command),
 - n marks set: mark lines by using the <Ctrl+F2> key or the **Mark All** option of the **Find** dialog. Once the string occurrences have been marked, jump from one string to another by using the F2 key. To go down, press the F2 key. To go up, use the <shift+F2> key. Use the <Ctrl+F2> key again to delete a marker and use the <Ctrl+Shift+F2> key to suppress all marks.
 - n undo/redo as for the others view,
 - n cut/copy/paste character strings,

- propagate modifications to the Logiscope project by building it again.

2.19 HTML View

Used to display quality, rule violation and test coverage reports as well as metrics, criterion or factor definitions in the quality model.

Can be launched from a file or a folder.

Always available when the Start Many Links mode is active.

Seek command

- Pop-up menu on the object

Result

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command displays the **Dictionary** tab in the **Workspace View**. It gives for each language (C++, C, Java and Ada), the basic metrics used for the different scopes: Application, Class (only available for C++ and Java) and Function.

A double click on a metric opens its description in html format in the result pane.

Mini Web - Pop-up menu

Hide or display the Mini Web bar

View

Can be launched from a toolbar.

Context

Always available.

Result

With a right click on a toolbar, a pop-up menu appears. The toolbar can be hidden or displayed depending on its current state.

See **Toolbars** tab in **Customize - Tools menu** command.

Move - Pop-up menu

Move a toolbar

View

Can be launched from an undocked toolbar.

Context

Always available from the title bar.

Result

With a right click on the title bar of a toolbar, a pop-up menu appears. The selection of the **Move** option allows to change the position of the toolbar.

New - File menu

Create a new project or workspace


View

Can be launched from all views.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+N>
- Button palette 

Result

Internal changes

The workspace and/or the project are created and loaded (the corresponding files are created at the specified location). The default folders of the new project are initialized.

Changes to the views

- The **File View** is updated.
- If a new workspace is created, all the modified files related to the previous workspace are prompted to save.

Possible errors

- No write access to a specified location.

New Application Criteria - Pop-up menu

Add a new application criterion

View

Can be launched from the Quality tab of any *QualityChecker* project.

Always available.

New Application Metric - Pop-up menu

Add a new application metric

Can be launched from the Quality tab of any *QualityChecker* project.

Context

Always available.

Result

Not available for the **File View** (if no other window is opened, the command will not be active).

Result

The current view is duplicated and its title changes (a number is added to differentiate each occurrence of the view). A new window is opened.

Next - Button palette

Navigate forward in the Script Wizard or an HTML view


View

Can be launched from the **Script Wizard** or an **HTML** view.

Context

It is possible to go forward.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command allows navigating forward in the **Script Wizard** or an **HTML** view: It displays the following page.

Next Item - Button palette

Navigate down in the Browse tab of the Output Window


View

Effective in the **Browse** tab of the **Output window**.

Context

Items must be displayed in the **Browse** tab of the **Output window**.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <F4>
- Button palette 

Result

This command allows to navigate down in the **Browse** tab: it goes to the item placed after the highlighted item of the displayed list and opens the view associated with this new selection (for example, the metric issued from **Criteria** or **Factors** tab).

If no item has been previously selected, the command goes to the first item of the list; when the last item is reached, it is wrapped up around the list.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Open - File menu

Open an existing file

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Always available.


Usage

This command is generally used to open an existing project (.tp), html, source or Tcl file. To open a workspace, it is better to use the **Open Workspace - File menu** command.

A project can only be edited inside a workspace: if the opened project has no associated workspace, a new one is automatically created inside *Studio*.

If changes have been made in the previous workspace and not saved, a dialog prompts to save it before loading the new project: **Yes** to save and continue the project loading, **No** to continue the command without saving the previous workspace, and **Cancel** to stop the command.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+O>
- Button palette 

Result

Internal changes

Opening a project loads the project and its workspace. All the project entities are loaded.

Changes to the views

- Opening a project or workspace: all the modified files relative to the previous workspace are prompted to save. The **File View** is updated.
- Opening a textual file (source or Tcl file): a view is opened in the result pane allowing changes.
- Opening an html file: a view is opened in the result pane to visualize it.

Possible errors

The following blocking errors may occur - due to Open dialog box entries:

- The file does not exist.
- The user does not have read access to the file to be opened.

In all these cases, the dialog box remains opened even after clicking **OK**. The user must enter another name or cancel the command.

Open Workspace - File menu

Open an existing workspace

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Always available.

Usage

This command is used to open an existing workspace (.ttw).

If the previous workspace was modified and not saved, a dialog lets save it before loading the new one (click **Yes**, **No** or **Cancel**).

Result

Internal changes

Opening a workspace loads the workspace and its project. All the project entities are loaded.

Changes to the views

All the modified files related to the previous workspace are prompted to save. The **File View** is updated.

Possible errors

See the **Open - File menu** command errors.

Options - Files - Project menu

Allow to choose the most significant option file

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Available only when the option files associated to the project exist.

Dialog

An Option Files dialog is displayed and allows using the arrows to select the most significant option file among all option files associated to the project. Click **Ok** to validate or **Cancel** to ignore.

Result

The file at the top list level in the dialog box becomes the most significant for the project.

Options - Save As - Project menu

Allow to save a project option in an option file

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when a project is loaded.

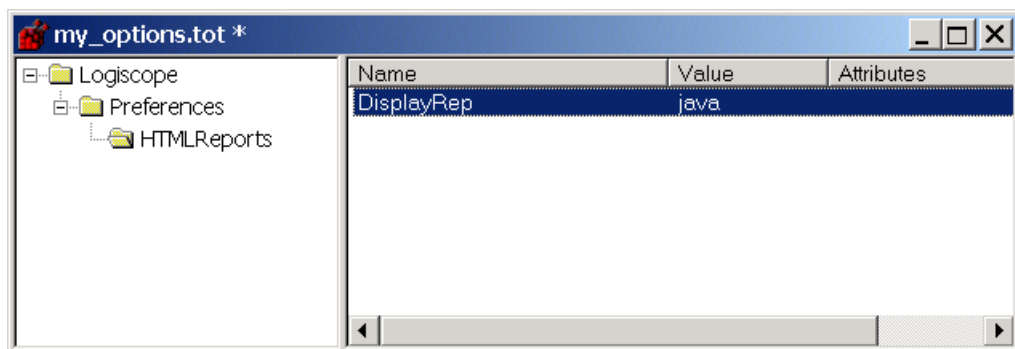
Dialog

The **Save As** dialog box opens. Use this file browser to name a file to be saved. If an existing file is selected, a warning is displayed: click **Yes** to override the existing file, or **No** to cancel and come back to the **Save As** dialog box.

Then another dialog box prompts to include this new file in the project or not. Click **Yes** or **No**.

Result

A new option file (suffixed by **.tot**) is created and appears in the **File View** project if **Yes** has been selected. The project option (HTML tables or Java applets) is saved in this file. Once added it can be suppressed from the project as any other file. Double-clicking on a such file in the **File View**, activates the options editor which allows to change and save options.



Options - Tools menu

Customize both Studio and HTML reports

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Always available.

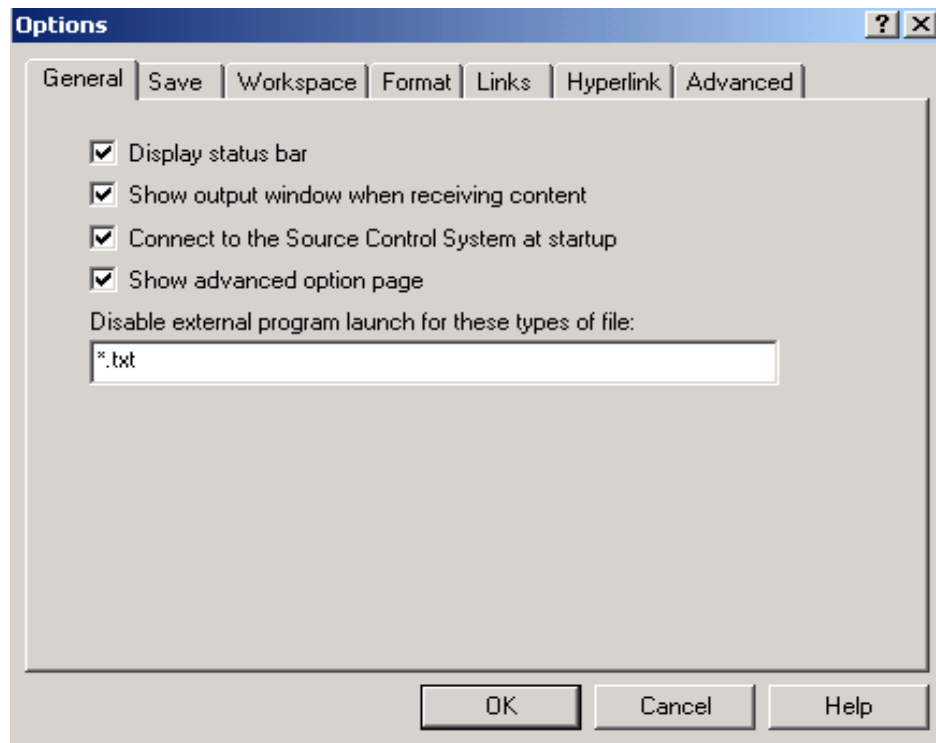

Dialog

A dialog box with several tabs is opened.

- The **General** tab allows to customize Studio behaviour regarding display options.



Display status bar: check/clear this option to show/hide the status bar.

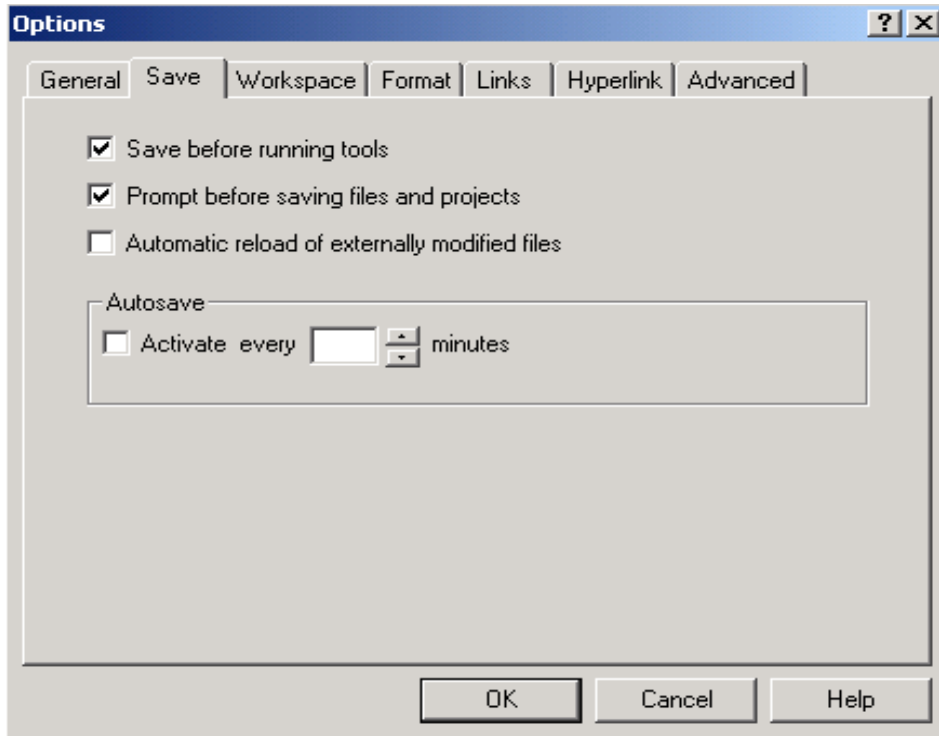

Connect to the Source Code Control System at startup: this option is available only if a source code control (SCC) system is installed. Check it to use the SCC system. If the option value is FALSE, the SCC menu and toolbar are not available.

Show advanced option page: check this option to display an additional property page (Advanced tab, described below) that displays all the options in a tree control.

Disable external program launch for these types of file: list in the field the file extensions (separated by a semi-colon) to open within Studio and not with an external program.

- The **Save** tab allows to customize Studio behaviour regarding save options.



Save before running tools must be checked to automatically save the modifications each time an external tool is launched.

Prompt before saving files and projects allows to ask question before saving files before running tools. This choice is only effective if the previous Save option is also checked, else it has no effect.

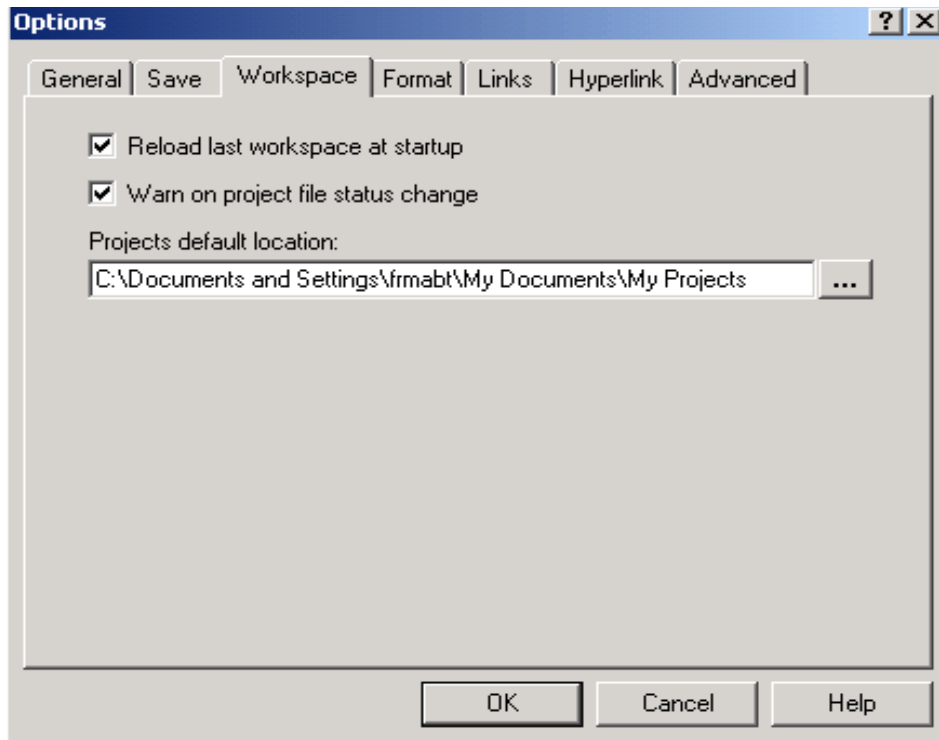
Automatic reload of externally modified files when a file included in a project is modified outside Studio, it detects that the file has changed and prompts to reload it. Checked not to be prompted.

Autosave

Activate: if this option is checked, autosave is activated by default every 10 minutes, but this delay can be changed.

Every: allow to increase or decrease the autosave delay.

- The **Workspace** tab allows to customize Studio behaviour regarding workspace options.

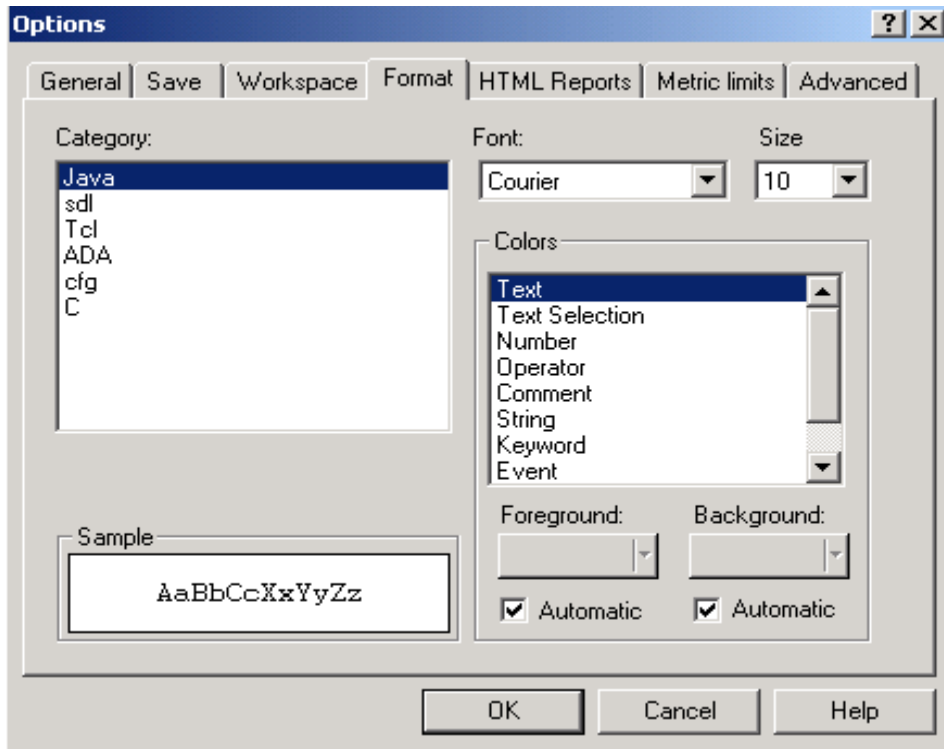


Reload last workspace at startup: if this option is checked, the last workspace is opened and loaded at startup.

Warn on project file status change: check this option to be warned when a project file (*.ttp) access right passes to ReadOnly in order not to loose the changes.

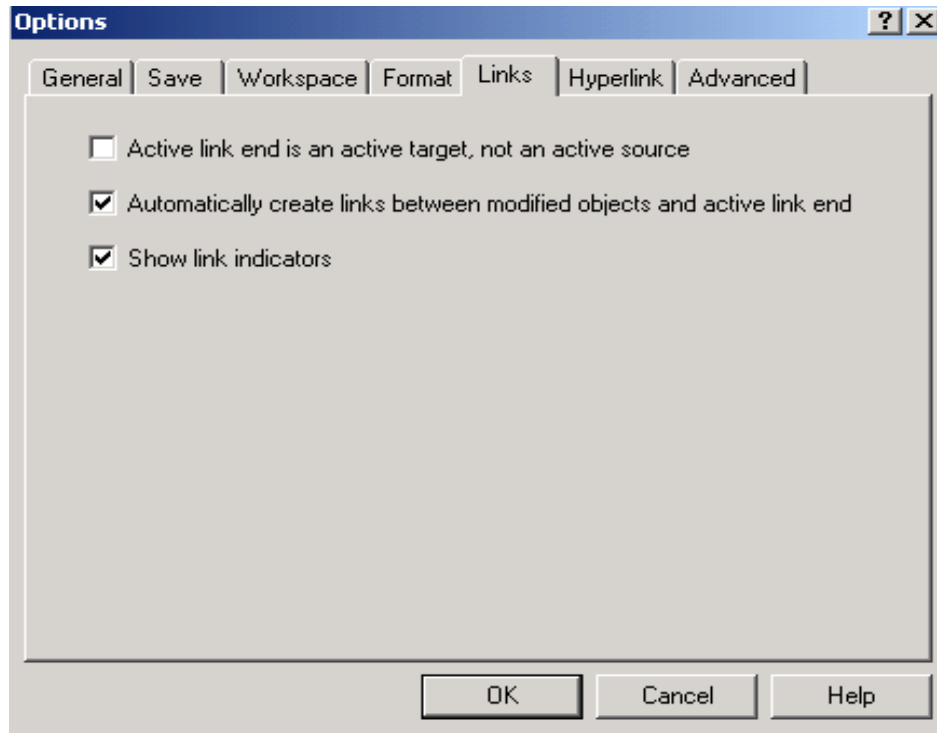
Projects default location: fill this field with the projects default location path.

- The **Format** tab allows to customize Studio behaviour regarding format options.



The user can define a font and a size for each type of file and a color to display each type of item in the file.

- The **Links** tab allows to customize Studio behaviour regarding link options.

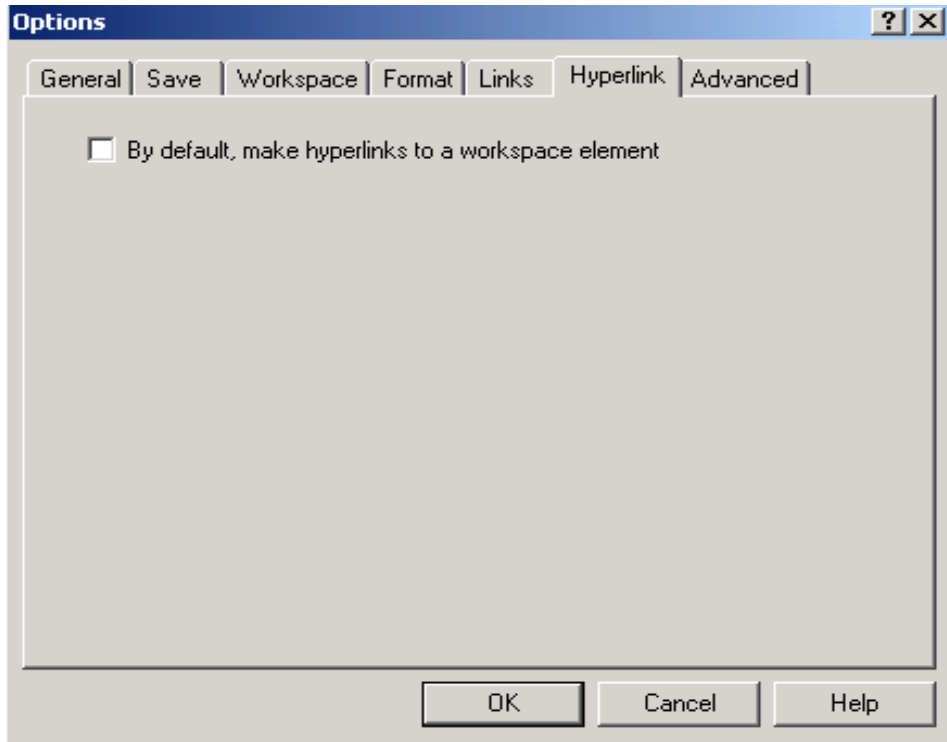


Active link end is an active target, not an active source: check this option to consider active end link as an active target.

Automatically create links between modified objects and active link end: check this option to create links between modified objects and active link end.

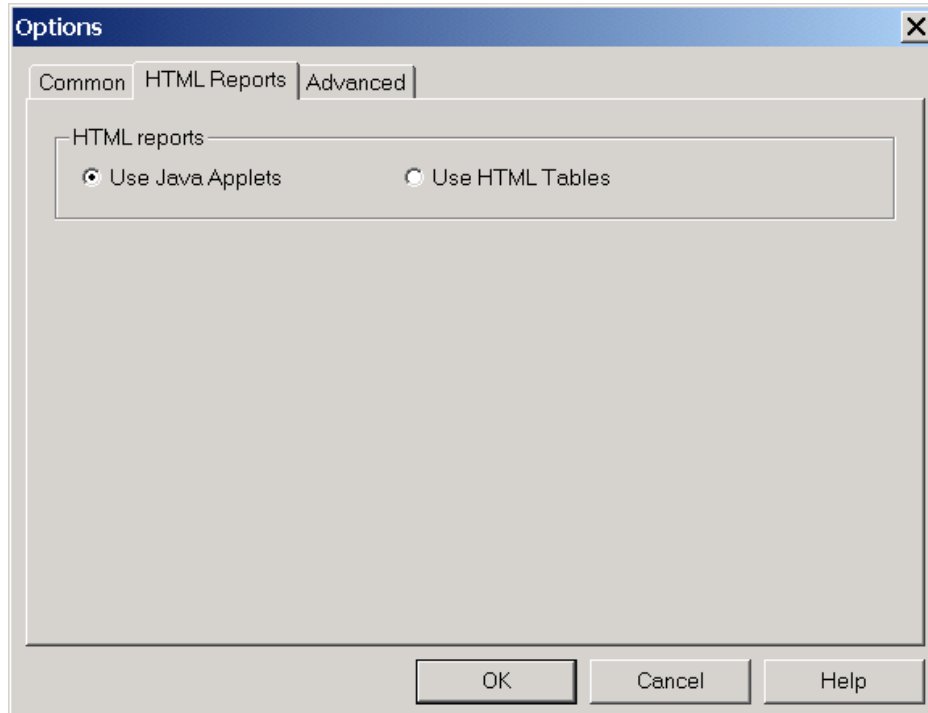

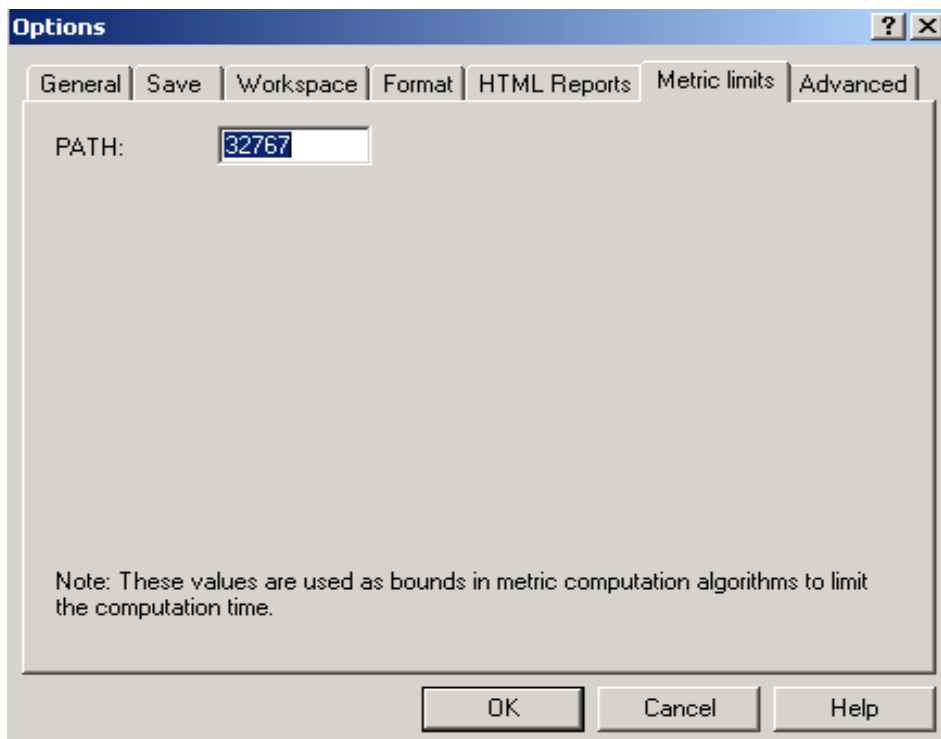


By default, make hyperlinks to a workspace element: check this option to make hyperlinks to a workspace element, by default.

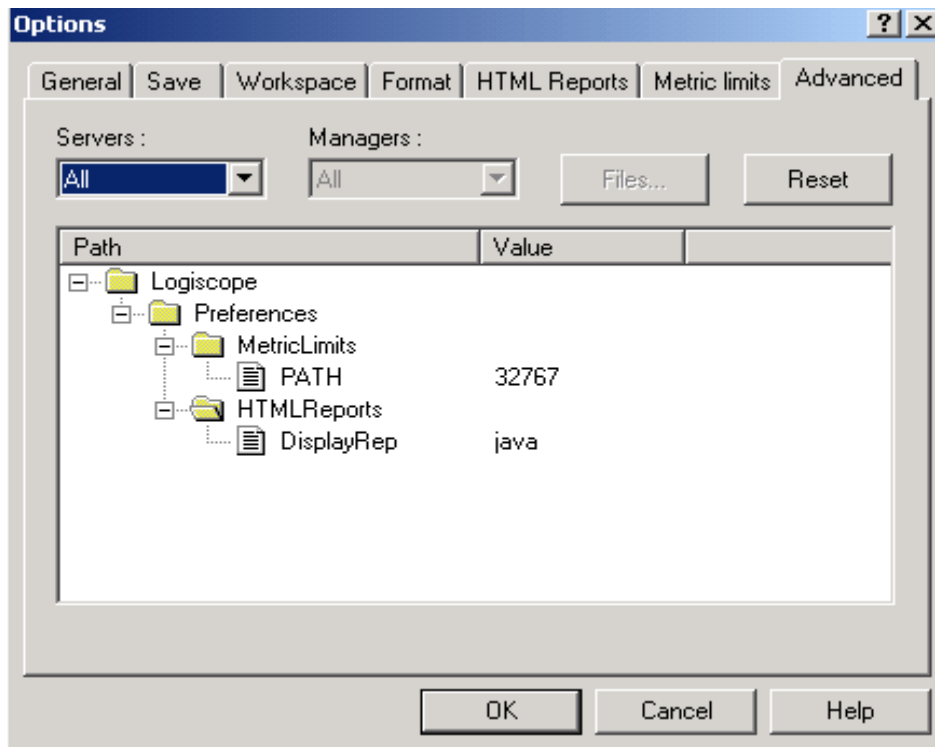
- The **HTML Reports** tab allows a choice between Java Applets (not available on UNIX) or HTML Tables in reports.



- The **Metric limits** tab allows to give a limit to the PATH metric, this value is used as a bound in computation algorithm to limit the time.



- The **Advanced** tab allows to edit the option values. MetricLimits and HTMLReports items are set using the previous tabs.



Output - View menu

Display or hide the output window

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Alt+2>
- Pop-up menu on a toolbar

Result

The output window (it also includes the **Messages**, **Build** and **Browse** tabs) is displayed or hidden, depending on whether it was hidden or displayed. A check box displayed before the command name in the **View** menu, indicates the current state of the output window: if the box is checked, the output window is currently displayed; if the box is not checked, it is hidden.

When hidden, the output window will be displayed again when a command using it is activated.

Paste - Edit menu

Paste the content of the paste buffer (entities previously copied or cut)

View

Can be launched from any **Textual View**.


Context

The paste buffer must contain entities that can be pasted in the view.

Usage

Click in the target view at a convenient place (or select an entity in the **File View**) before calling the **Paste** command.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+V>
- Pop-up menu
- Button palette 

Result

Internal changes

The paste buffer is written in the **Textual View**.

Previous Item - Button palette

Navigate up in the **Browse** tab of the **Output window**


View

Effective in the **Browse** tab of the **output window**.

Context

Items must be displayed in the **Browse** tab of the **Output window**.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Shift+F4>
- Button palette 

Result

This command allows to navigate in the **Browse** tab: it selects the item placed before the highlighted item of the displayed list and opens the view associated with it (for example the metric issued from **Criteria** or **Factors** tab).

If no item is currently selected, the command selects the last item of the list; when the first item is reached, it is wrapped up around the list.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Print - File menu

Print or generate a print file of the current view


View

Can be launched from any view, except views of the **Workspace View**.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+P>
- Button palette 

Dialog

This command displays a **Print** dialog box that allows to:

- select a printer and modify its properties,
- choose to print to a file (**.prn**); in this case a **Print to File** dialog box opens and lets select the target file.
- choose to print the whole document or only some pages,
- specify the number of printed copies.

Click **Cancel** to stop the command or **OK** to validate.

Result

The content of the current view is printed.

Possible errors

Insufficient access rights to the selected file.

Print Manager - File menu

Not applicable to Logiscope

Print Preview - File menu

Display the current view before printing

View

Can be launched from any **Textual View**.

Context

Always available.

Result

A print preview is displayed in a separate window. Controls are provided to zoom and scroll through the pages.

Print Setup - File menu

Set the printer options

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Always available.

Result

The current printer name and options are displayed and can be modified.

Project - Pop-up menu

Hide or display the Project bar

View

Can be launched from a toolbar.

Context

Always available.

Result

With a right click on a toolbar, a pop-up menu appears. The toolbar can be hidden or displayed depending on its current state.

See **Toolbars** tab in **Customize - Tools menu** command.

Properties - View menu

Display or modify an entity characteristics


View

Can be launched from the **File View** and from any html file.

Context

Requires the selection of the entity whose characteristics are to be displayed or modified.

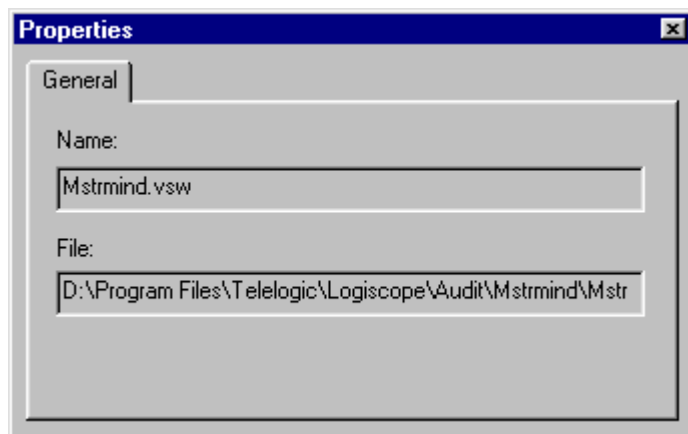

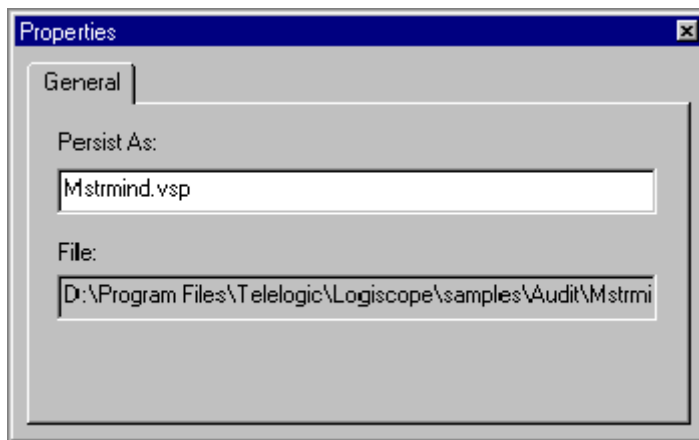

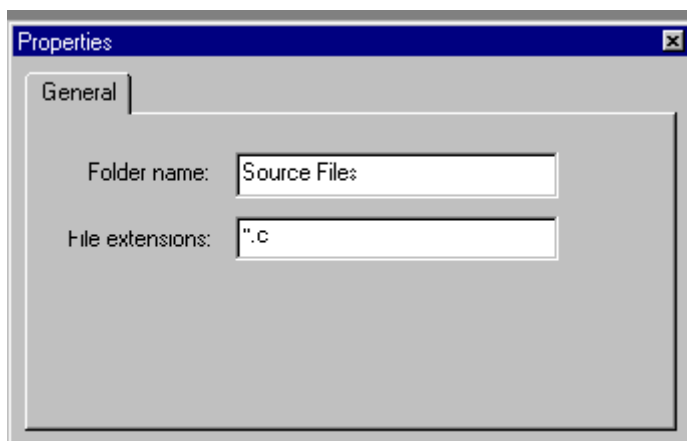

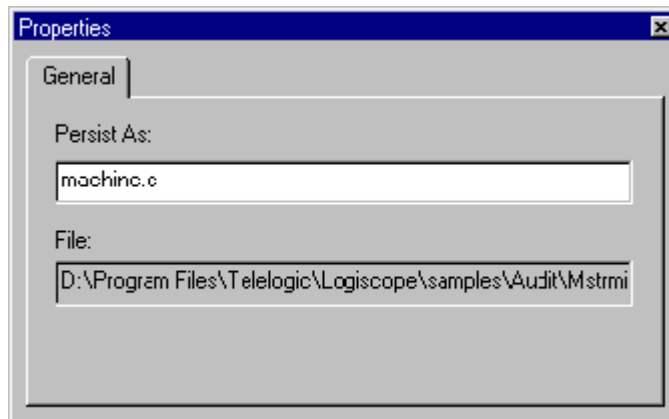

A double click on a criterion opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A double click on a class or on a function opens its source file.

A double click on an item (application, class or function) in a criterion category displays the **Browse** tab in the output window with metrics used in the quality model for the related scope (Application, Class or Function).

A double click on a metric in the **Browse** tab opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Quality - Factor Level - Browse menu

Display the factor values for the current project


View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when an *QualityChecker* project is loaded and built.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command displays the **Factors** tab in the **Workspace View**. It gives the factor values for the current project.

A double click on a factor opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A double click on a class or on a function opens its source file.

A double click on an item (application, class or function) in a factor category displays the **Browse** tab in the output window with metrics used in the quality model for the related scope (Application, Class or Function).

A double click on a metric in the **Browse** tab opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Quality - Quality Report - Browse menu

Display the quality report for the current project


View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when an *QualityChecker* project is loaded and built.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <F9>
- Button palette 

Result

This command opens the **Quality Report** in the result pane. The links in html format allow access to quality elements related to the project:

- the value and the description of factors, criteria and metrics for application, class and function scopes,
- the list of source files.

Note: The report is generated in the tmp and is deleted when the report window is closed, but it can be saved using the "Save As" command.

Rebuild all - Project menu

Regenerate all results (output and files) for the active project


View

Can be launched from the **File View**.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <F7>
- Button palette 

Result

This command generates results (output and files) for the active project. Even if the project has already been built, this forces a rebuild of the entire project. The options used to generate are those of the active configuration (see the **Settings... - Project menu** command for more details). The output files are generated in the project directory.

Note: consult IBM Rational Logiscope RuleChecker & QualityChecker Getting Started and IBM Rational Logiscope TestChecker Getting Started for more information on the generation.

Recent Files - File menu

List the last eight files used and allow to choose a file to open in this list

View

Can be launched from any **Textual View**.

Context

Always available.

Result

The chosen file is opened in the result pane.

Recent Workspaces - File menu

List the last eight workspaces used and allow to choose a workspace to load in this list

View

Can be launched from any **Textual View**.

Context

Always available.

Result

The chosen workspace is loaded.

Redo - Edit menu

Restore a previously undone action

View


Can be launched from all views.

Context

Available after the **Undo - Edit menu** command.

*Note: if an action has been performed after the **Undo** command, the **Redo** command is no longer available.*

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+Y>
- Pop-up menu
- Button palette 

Result

The last actions canceled with the **Undo** command are restored.

Refresh - Button palette

Reload an HTML page


View

Can be launched from the **Script Wizard** or an **HTML** view.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

The current page is loaded again and the display is refreshed.

Replace - Edit menu

Find a character string and replace it by another one

View

Can be launched from a **Textual View**.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+H>

Dialog

A dialog box is opened. It contains the following fields:

- **Find what** to enter the character string to be searched; a scrolling list containing the previous searched strings also allows to choose one of them without re-entering it. If a string was selected in the text before starting the command, this string appears in this field.
- **Replace with** to enter the replacement for the searched character string; a scrolling list containing the previous replacement strings also allows to choose one of them without re-entering it.
- **Match whole word only**: select it to search isolated occurrences of the string only.
- **Match case**: select it to discriminate between uppercase and lowercase characters.
- **Replace In**: select **Selection** to limit the find and replace operation to the previously selected text; select **Whole file** to use the “find and replace” method in the whole document.

The dialog box contains the following buttons:

- **Find Next** to find the next occurrence of the string.
- **Replace** to replace the current occurrence and find the next occurrence of the string.
- **Replace All** to replace all occurrences.
- **Cancel** to cancel the command.

The previous state of the file is restored and the display is refreshed.

Rule - Rule Violations - Browse menu

Display the rule violations for the current project

Can be launched from any view.

Only available when a *RuleChecker* project is loaded and built.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command displays the **Violations** tab in the **Workspace View**. It gives the violated, the clean (not violated) and ignored rules for the current project.

A double click on a rule opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A double click on a violated line opens the corresponding source file and highlights the violation.

Rule - Rule Violations by Files - Browse menu

Display the rule violations by files for the current project

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when a *RuleChecker* project is loaded and built.

Result

This command displays the **File Violations** tab in the **Workspace View**. It displays the files in the current project where the violations occurred.

A double click on a rule opens its description in the result pane.

A double click on a violated line opens the corresponding source file and highlights the violation.

Rule - Rule Violations List - Browse menu

Display the rule violation list for the current project


View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when a *RuleChecker* project is loaded and built.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command displays the rule violation list in the **Browse** tab of the output window. It gives for each rule the violations location (line).

A double click on a violated line opens the corresponding source file and highlights the violation.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Rule - Rule Violations Report - Browse menu

Display the rule violation report for the current project


View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when a *RuleChecker* project is loaded and built.

Seek command

- Button palette 

Result

This command displays the rule violation report in the result pane the links in html format allow access to violations by file and by rule for the current project.

Note: The report is generated in the tmp and is deleted when the report window is closed, but it can be saved using the "Save As" command.

Save - File menu

Save the selected file and associated files


View

Can be launched from the **File View**.

Context

A file (**.ttw**, **.ttp** or **textual**) must be selected.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+S>

The **Save As** dialog box opens. Use this file browser to name a file to be saved. If an existing file is selected, a warning is displayed: click '**Yes**' to override the existing file, or '**No**' to cancel and come back to the **Save As** dialog box.

Result

The current description is saved in the designated file. This command has no impact on the current project: the new file is not referenced by the current project (meaning this command can be seen as an export command).

Possible errors

The designated file cannot be write accessed. A message is displayed in an **Error** box. The command is canceled.

Save Workspace - File menu

Save the current workspace

A workspace is opened.

Result

This command opens the **Script Wizard** that allows to navigate in the **UML** representation of a IBM Rational Logiscope model and to create Tcl scripts to extract information from the model (for more details see paragraph 2.17, *Script Wizard*).

Select All - Edit menu

Select all entities in the current Textual View

View

Can be launched from a **Textual View**.

Context

Always available.

Seek command

- Shortcut: <Ctrl+A>
- Pop-up menu

Result

All current view entities are selected.

Select from Properties - Browse menu

Allow to select classes or methods/functions for the current project according to a criterion or a factor evaluation degree

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

Only available when an *QualityChecker* project is loaded and built. If in a multi-project context, only the active (currently selected) project is considered.

Result

This command displays a **User Request** tab in the **Workspace View**. It gives for the current project the list of classes or methods/functions for the chosen criterion or factor evaluation degree.

A double click on a class or on a method/function opens its source file in the result pane and its metrics values in the **Browse** tab of the output window.

A double click on a metric in the **Browse** tab opens its description in html format in the result pane.

A click on a column header in the **Browse** tab sorts the list in ascending order.

Note: make as many requests as needed by adding them in the User Request tab or by creating a new tab.

Settings... - Project menu

Set current tool options for the current project and configuration

View

Can be launched from any view.

Context

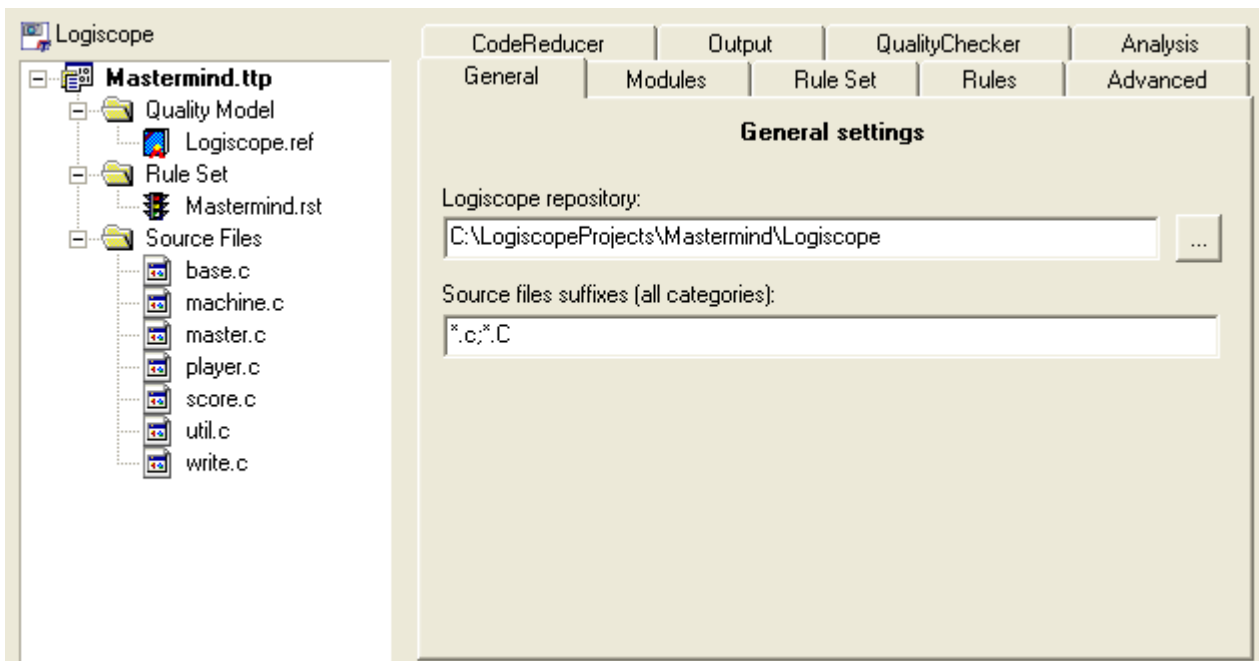

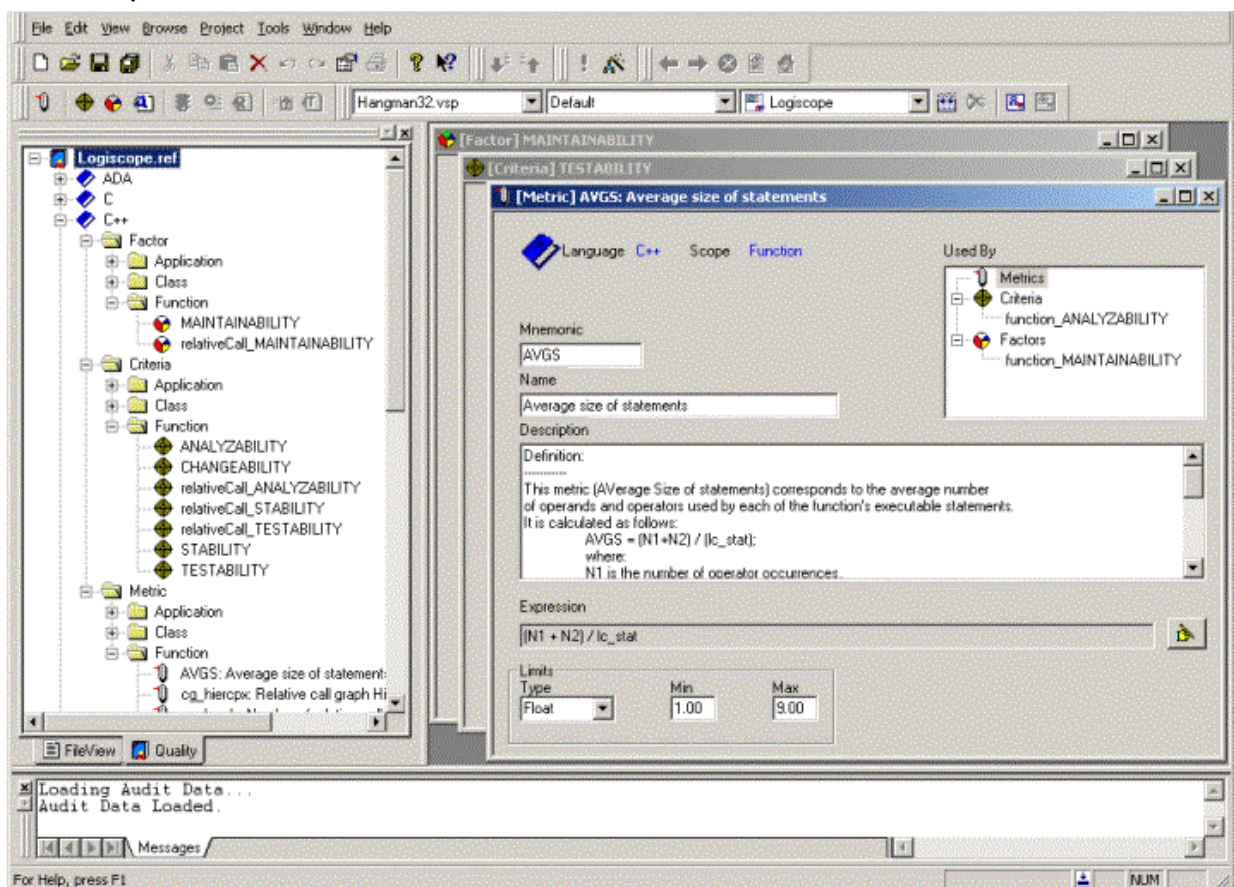
Chapter 4

Quality Model Editor

4.1 Starting the Quality Model Editor

The Quality Model Editor allows to display and modify the Quality Model used for a *Logiscope QualityChecker* project.

With Logiscope **Studio**, load or create a *QualityChecker* project. Double-click on the Quality Model file in the project workspace. The Quality Model Editor is displayed together with the metrics, criteria and factors used in the Quality Model for the required language.



Default Quality Model files are supplied: e.g. **Logiscope.ref** in the **Ref** folder of the Logiscope standard installation directory.

4.2 Overview of Quality Model Editor

Views

When the quality model editor is activated, three windows are displayed in the result pane:

- **[Factor]** quality editor,
- **[Criteria]** quality editor,
- **[Metric]** quality editor.

With the use of these editors, all the existing items in the quality model can be modified and new items can be added.

4.2.1 Quality (Tab) view



This quality view presents all the factor, criteria and metric items used for each language scope. The following actions can be performed on these items:

Add

New items can be added to the quality model. This is done by selecting a location in the quality view with the right mouse button. A pop-up menu is displayed with a list of item types that can be added. The items in the menu list are dependent on the cursor location.

When a new item is added, a corresponding blank editor window is displayed in the result pane. Modifications in this editor window can be performed as described above.

Delete

Existing items can be removed from the quality model. This is done by selecting the item in the quality view and pressing the **Delete** or **Backspace** keys. The item is removed from the quality view and the corresponding editor is cleared.

Only items with no links to other items can be deleted. For example, the item Criteria-Application-ANALYZABILITY can only be deleted if Factor-Application-MAINTAINABILITY is deleted first.

Rename

Existing items can be renamed in the quality model. This is done by clicking the item twice. Modification to the name in the quality view are duplicated in the corresponding editor window.

Appendix A

Data Model

A.1 Introduction

The IBM Rational Logiscope API (Application Programming Interface) is based on a data model as described below. This UML metamodel describes the project structure and Logiscope entities. To see Logiscope data model, browse through **Script Wizard**. This function allows to create or adapt Tcl scripts to customize interface or generated results (for more details on the **Script Wizard** function see Section 2.17).

At first the symbols used in a data model representation will be explained. Then the data model itself will be shown in graphic form and in text format.

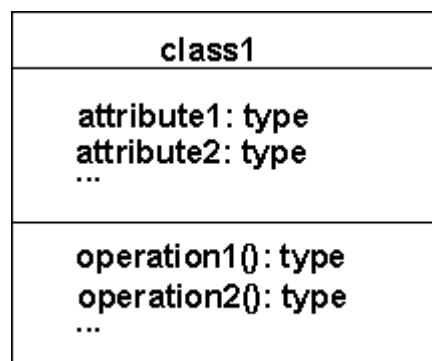
Examples of Tcl scripts using the Logiscope API as described in Appendix A can be found in the `<log_install_dir>/Scripts` directory.

A.2 Concepts and symbolism

A data model is represented as a class diagram. Here is the definition and representation of object-oriented concepts appearing in graphic form in a data model.

A.2.1 Class

A class is a set of objects with similar properties (attributes), common behaviors (operations) and share relations with other objects.



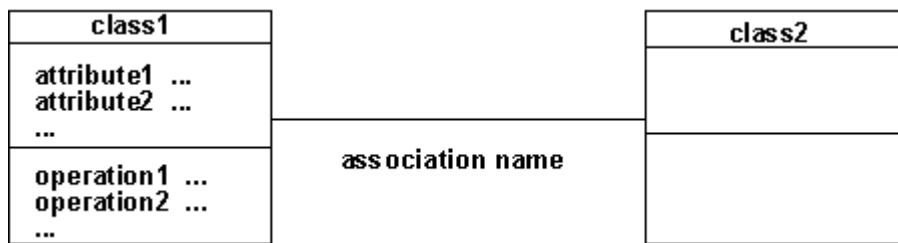
A.2.2 Attribute

An attribute is a data item specific to objects of a given class. Each attribute name is unique in its class. Each attribute has a value of the specified type (string, integer, etc.) for every object instance.

A.2.3 Operation

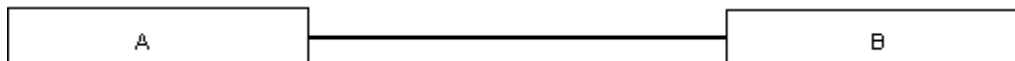
An operation is a function or a transformation that can be applied to objects of a class or carried out by them. All the objects in a given class share the same operations. The type associated to an operation indicates the type of value returned by the operation.

A.2.4 Link and association

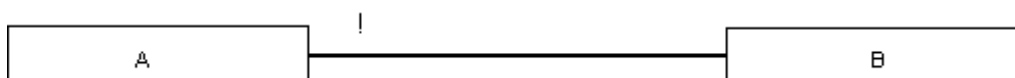


A link is a physical or conceptual connection between two instances of an object:

- A-to-B link and B-to-A link:



- A-to-B link only (the origin side of the link is indicated by the exclamation point !):

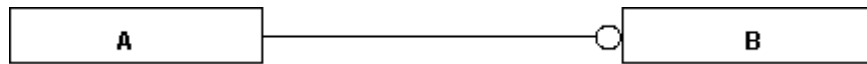


An association describes a set of links just as a class describes a set of objects.

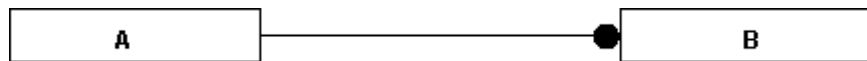
A.2.5 Multiplicity

The multiplicity specifies the number of class instances related to an instance of the associated class. Multiplicity (or cardinality) can be a range of values, a set of values or a specific number.

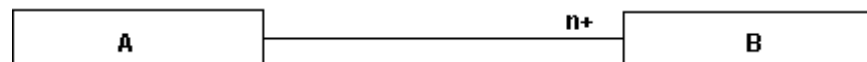

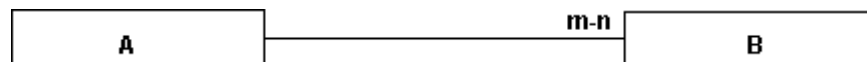

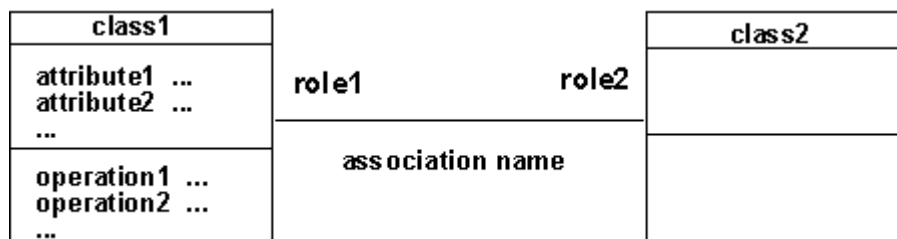

A.2.6 Role

A role is one end of an association. A binary association has two roles, each with its own name. The name of a role is a name that clearly identifies one end of an association. Roles make possible to consider a binary association as the link of one object to an associated set of objects. Each role in a binary association identifies an object or set of objects associated with an object at the other end.



The name of a role is a derivative attribute whose value is a set of associated objects.

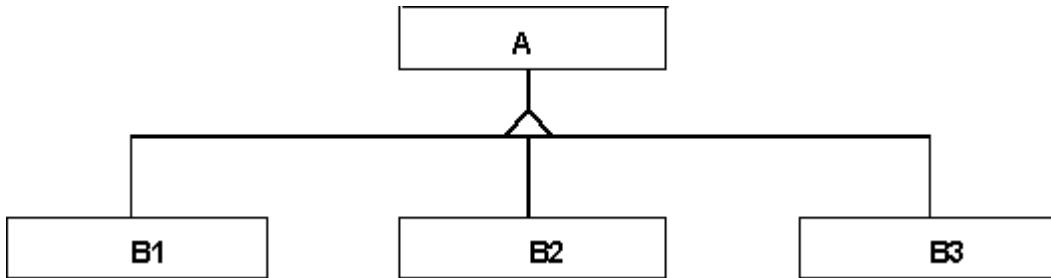
There are two cases for which roles must absolutely be named:

- recursive associations,
- several associations involving the same classes.

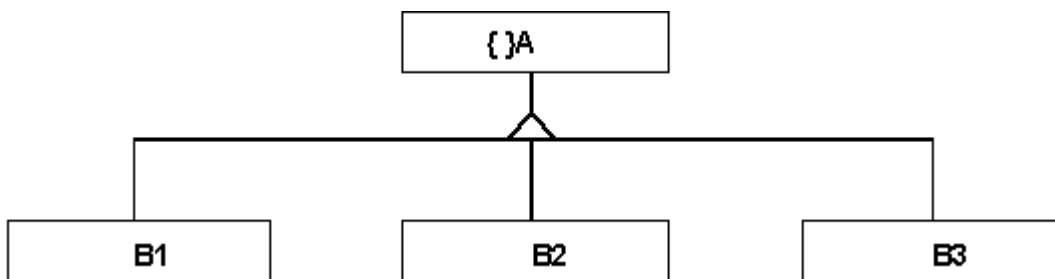
If roles are not named, the class name is taken as the role name, with the first letter changed to lower-case.

A.2.7 Inheritance

The “is a kind of” relation allows classes to share similarities and retain their differences.



A.2.8 Abstract class



An abstract class is a class with no instantiated objects. Attributes and operations it describes are inherited by its sub-classes.

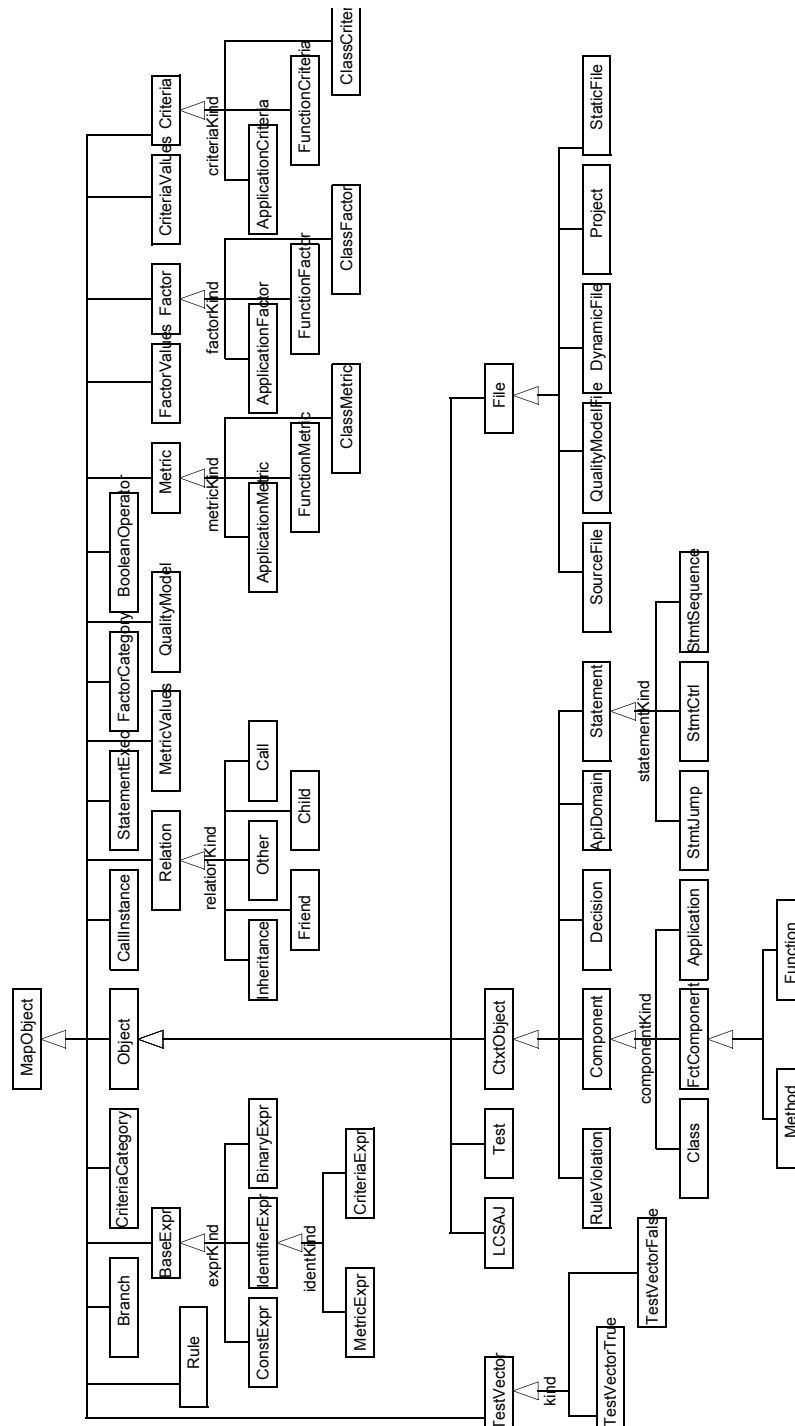


Figure 1 Inheritance overview diagram

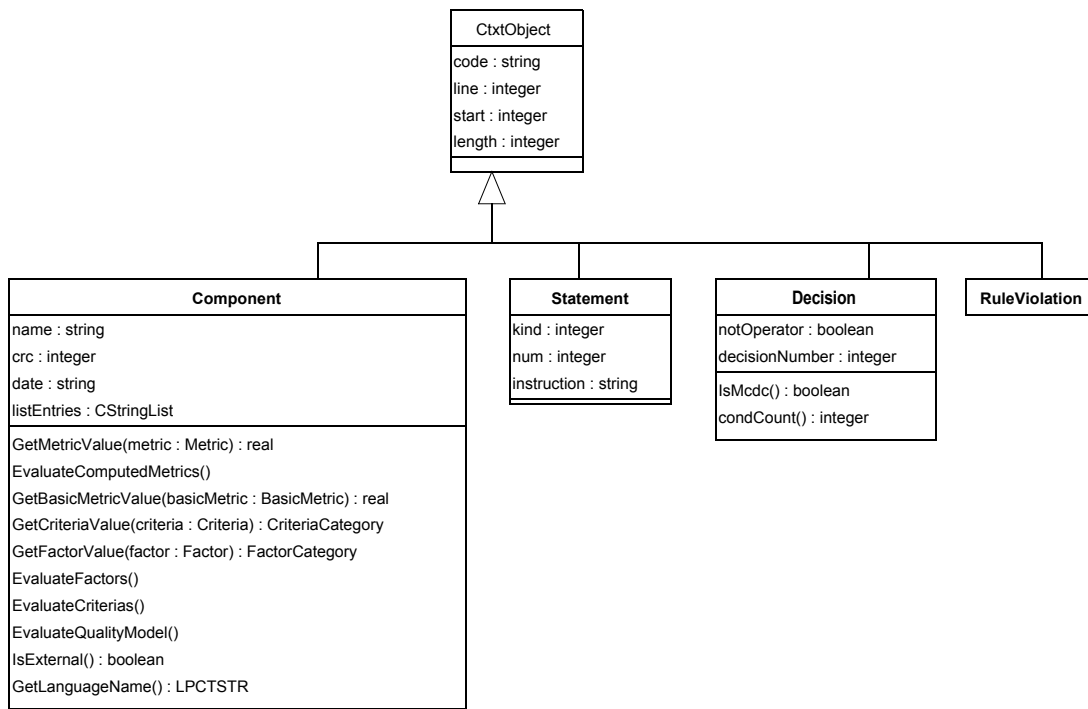


Figure 2 ContextObject diagram

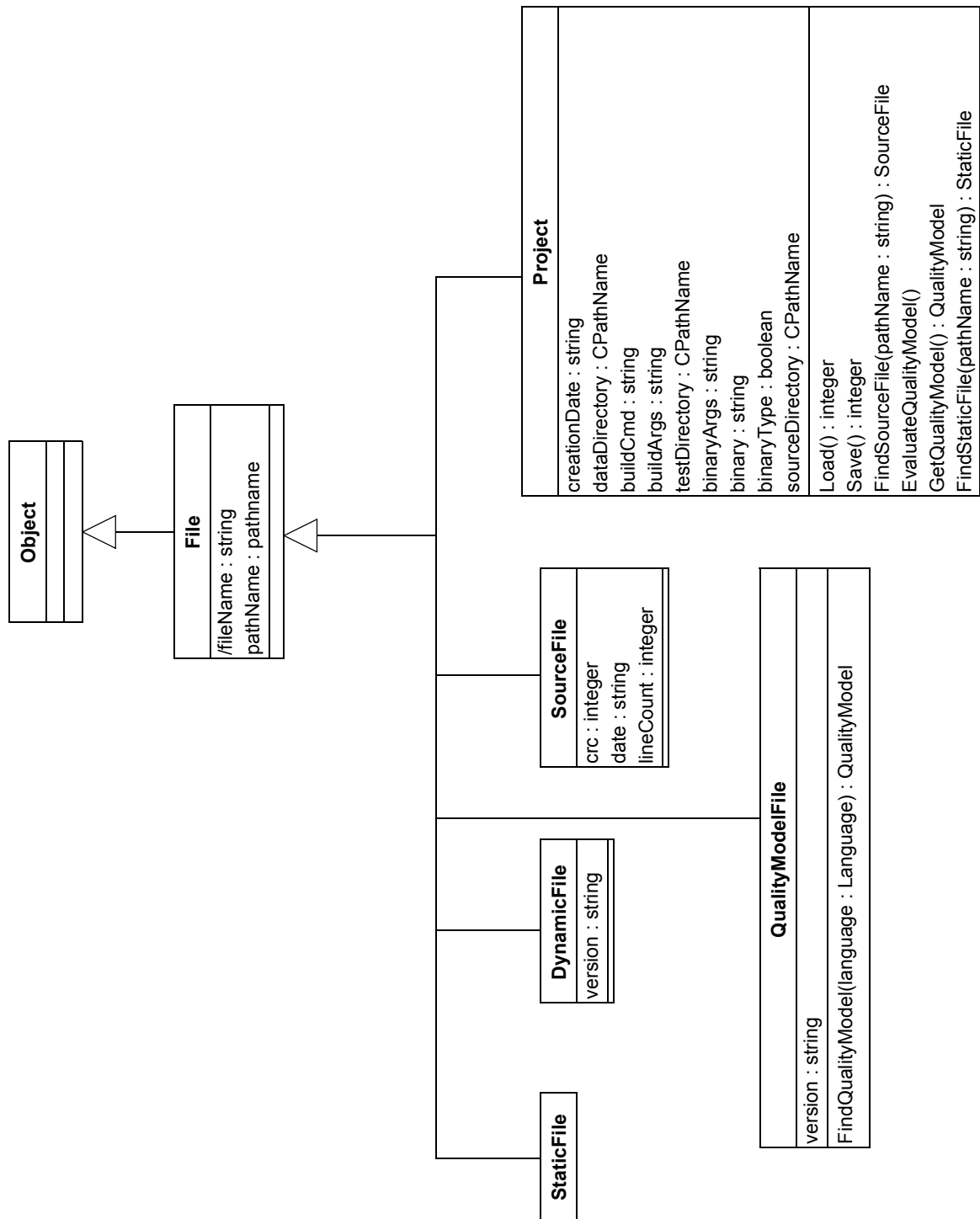


Figure 3 File diagram

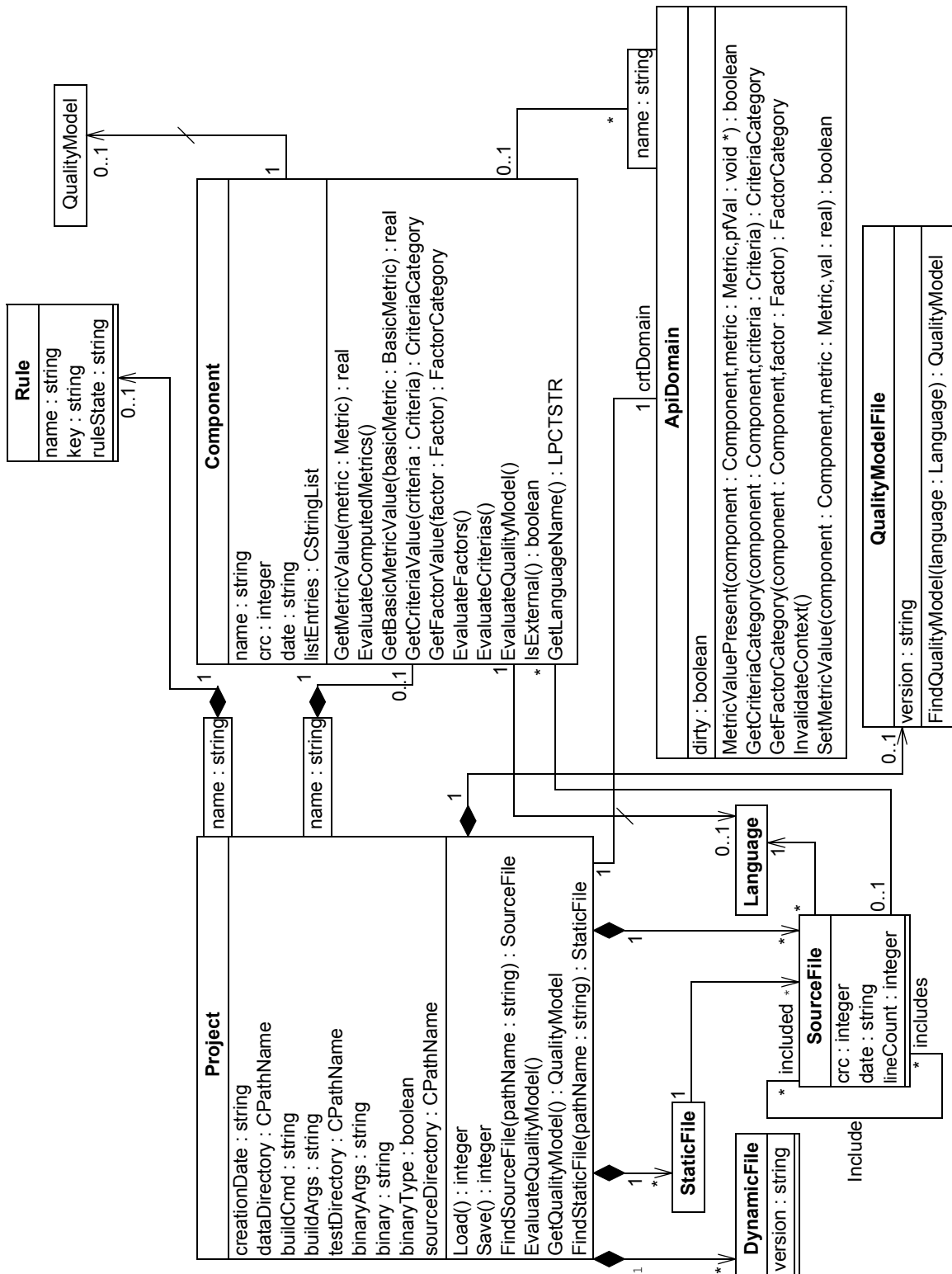


Figure 4 Project diagram

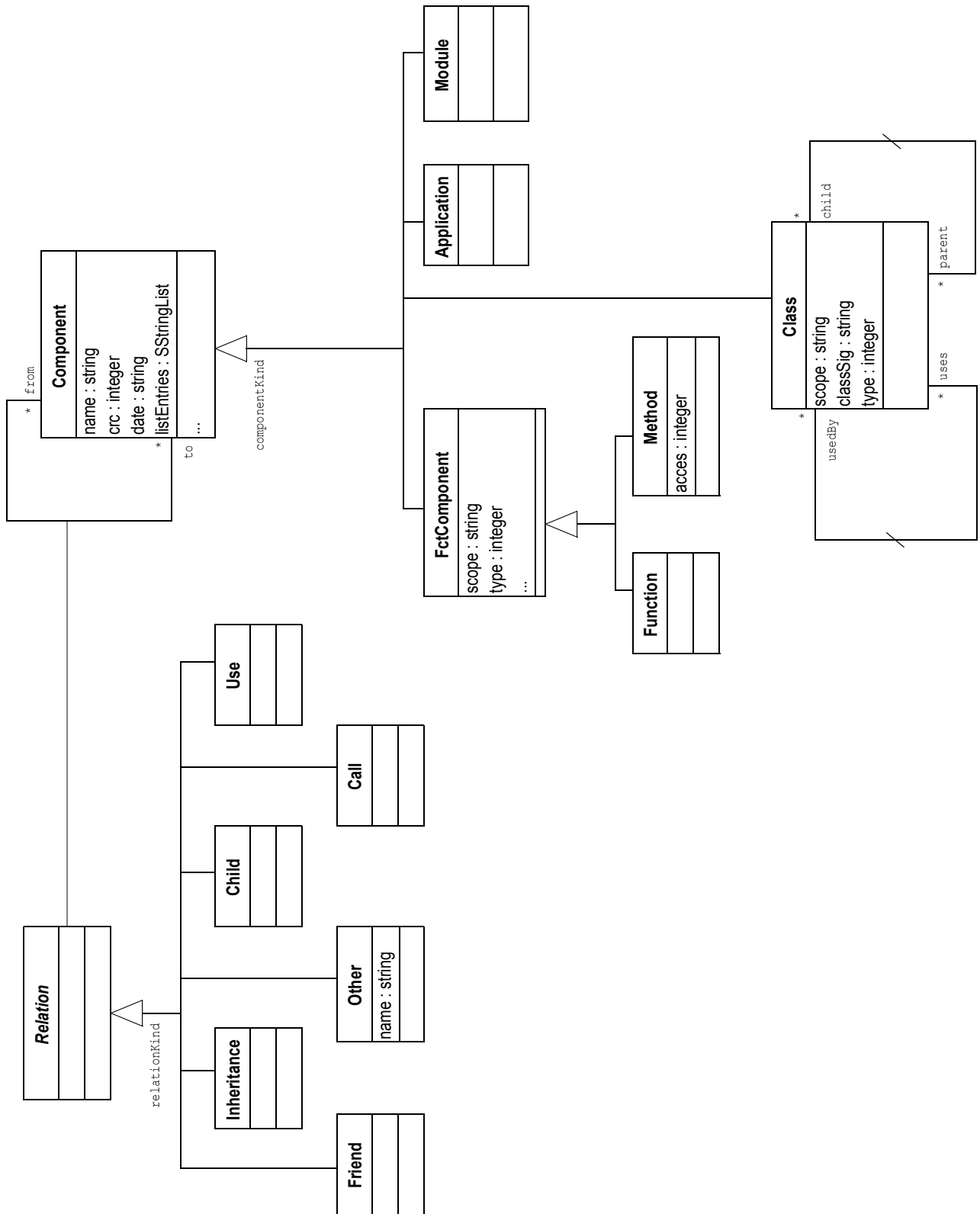


Figure 5 Component diagram

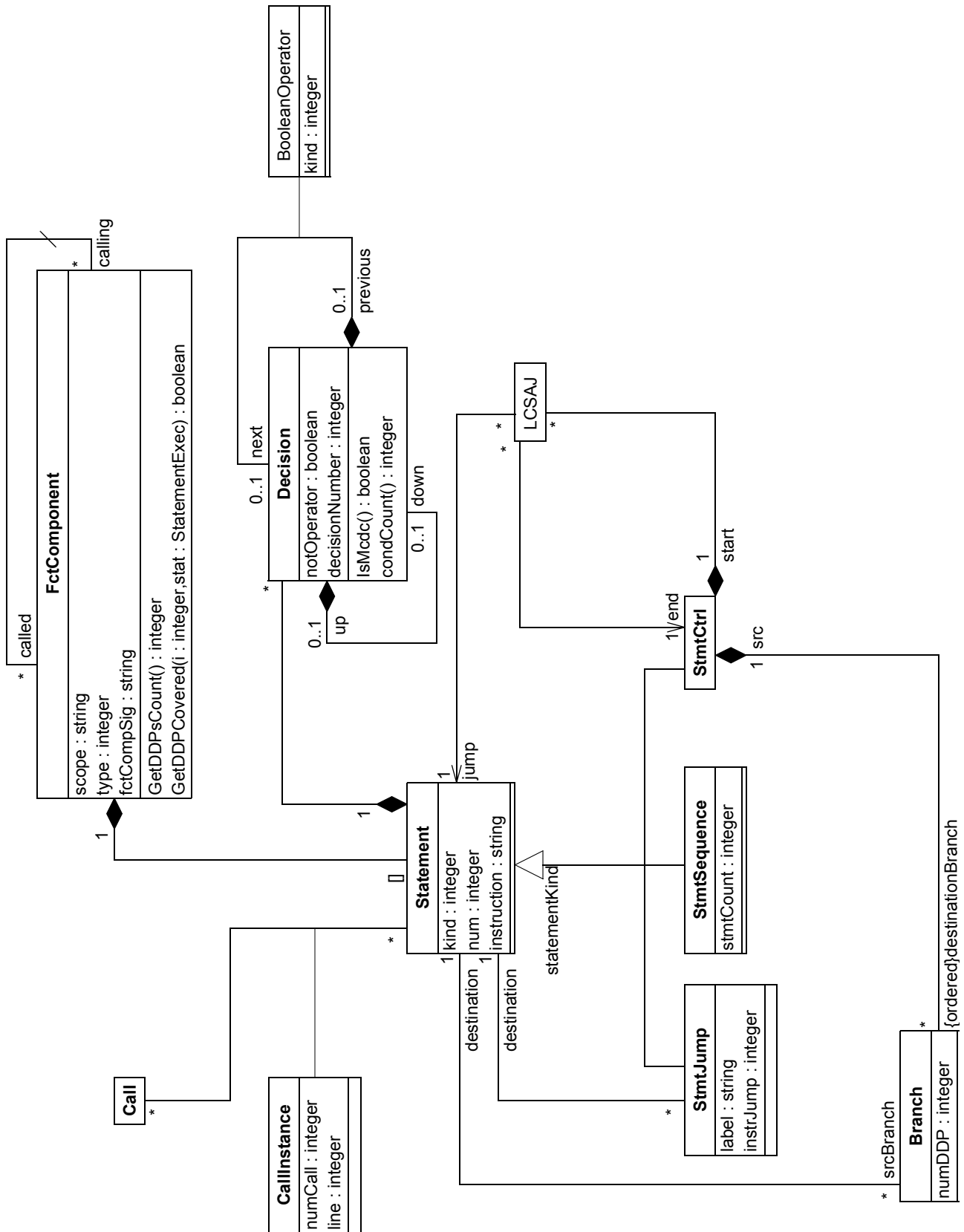


Figure 6 Statement diagram

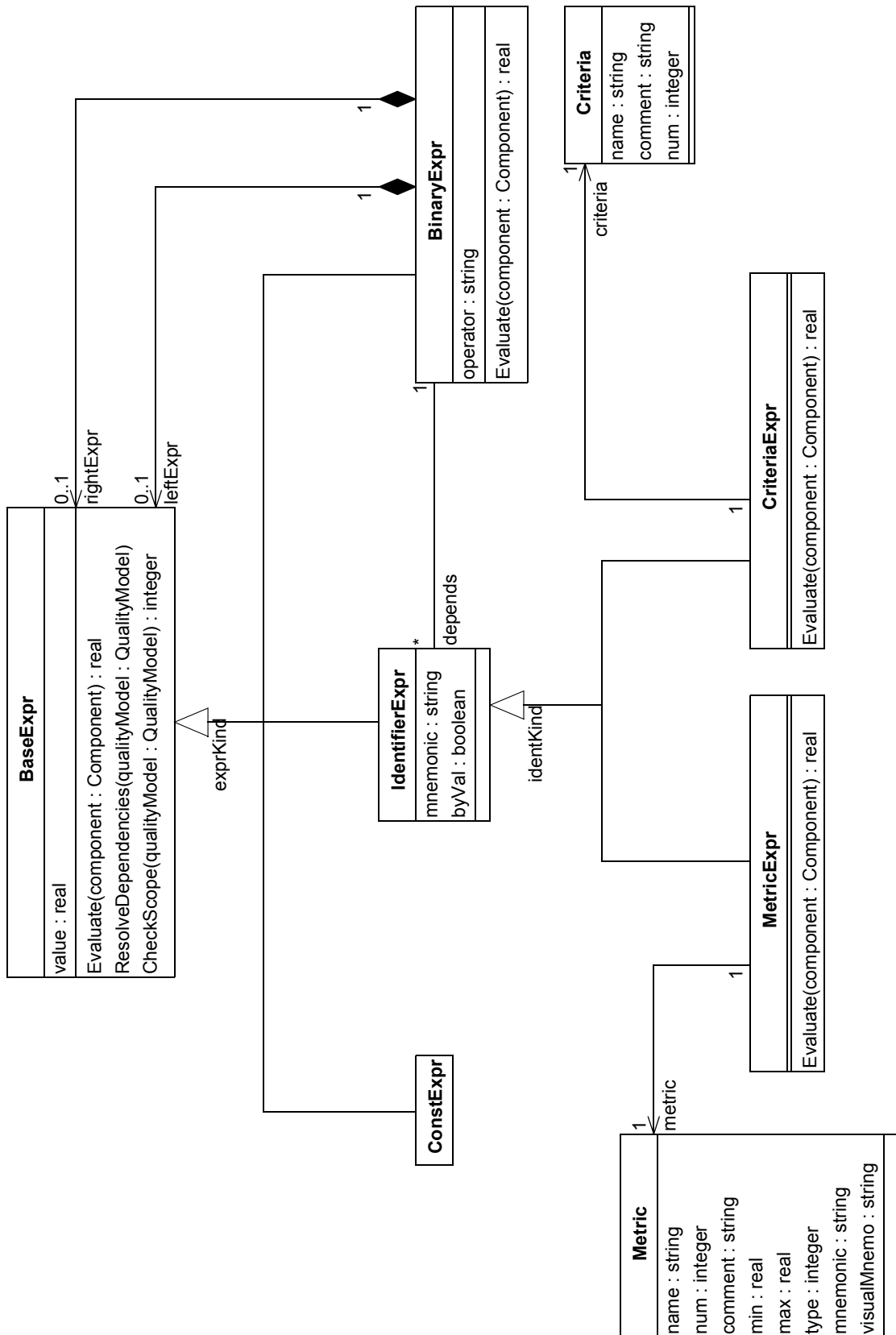


Figure 7 Expression diagram

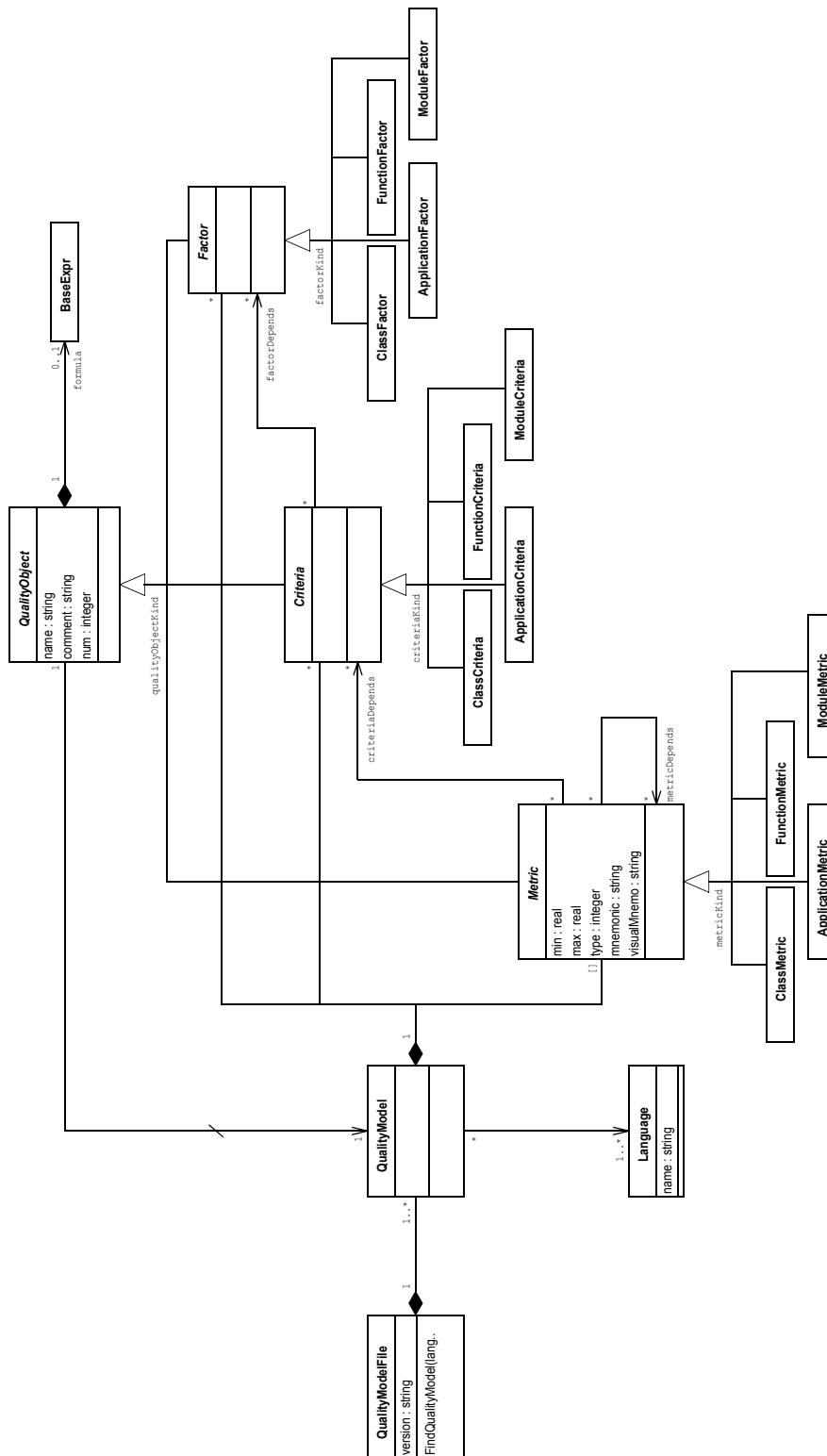


Figure 8 QualityModel diagram

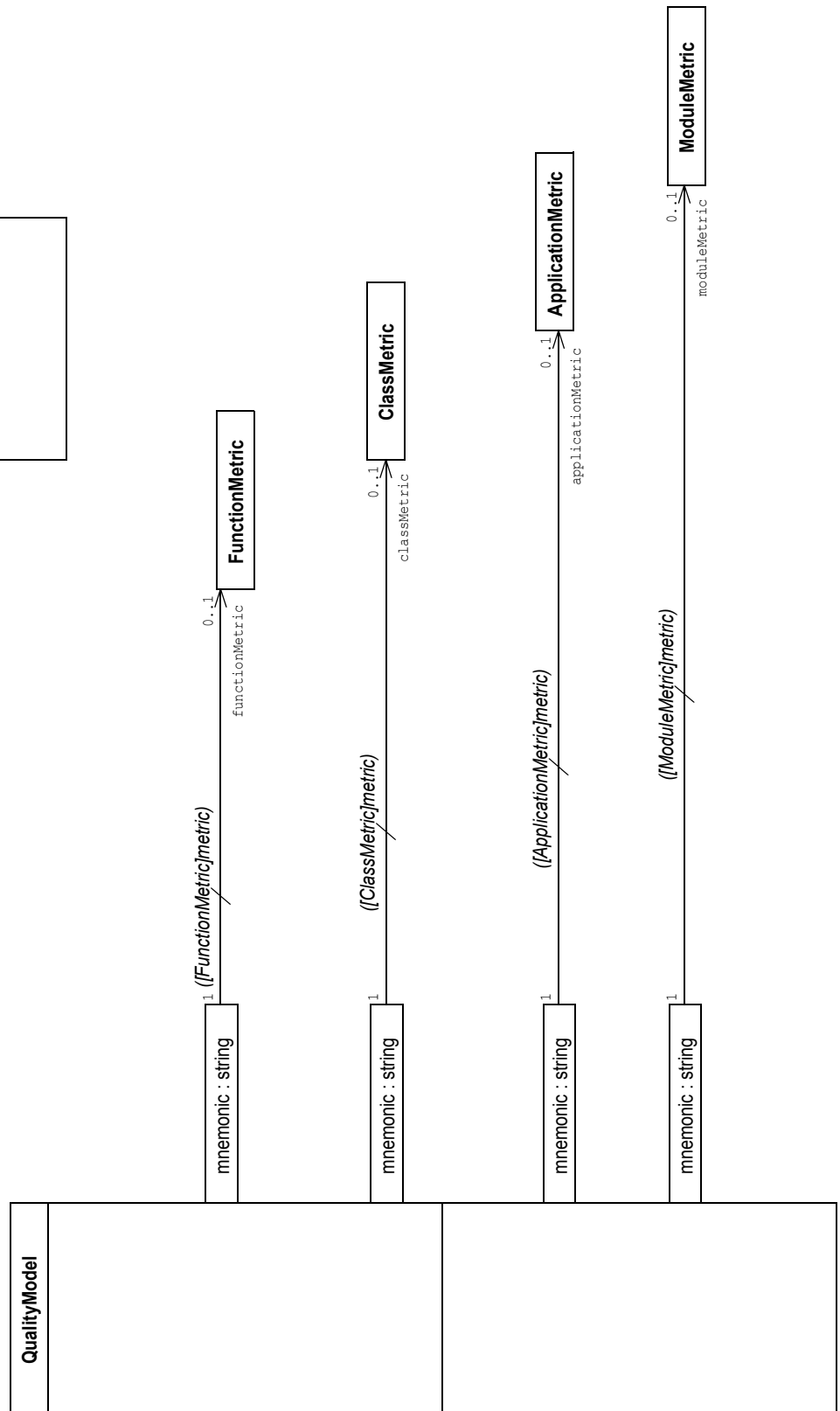


Figure 9 Metric Maps diagram

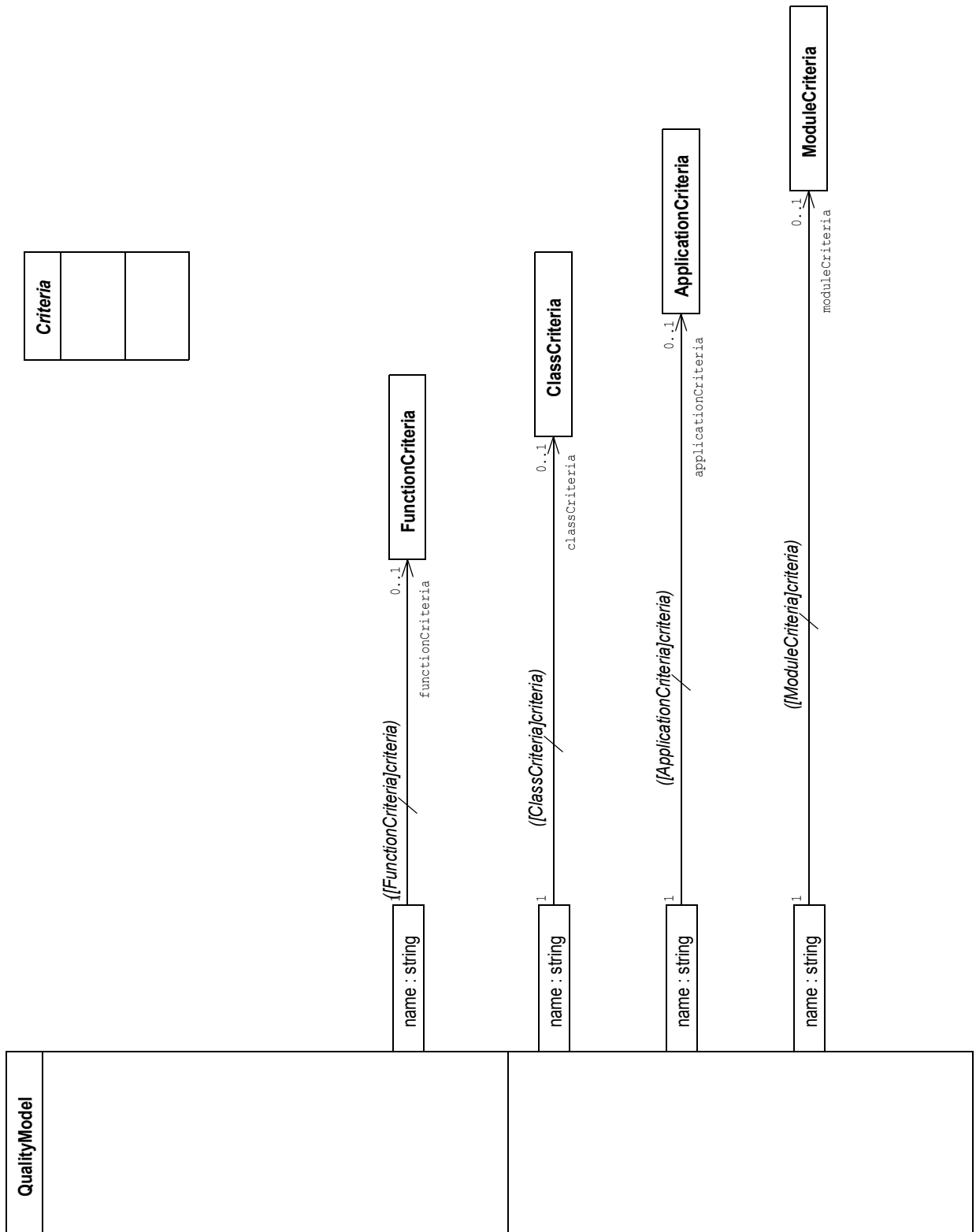


Figure 10 Criteria Maps diagram

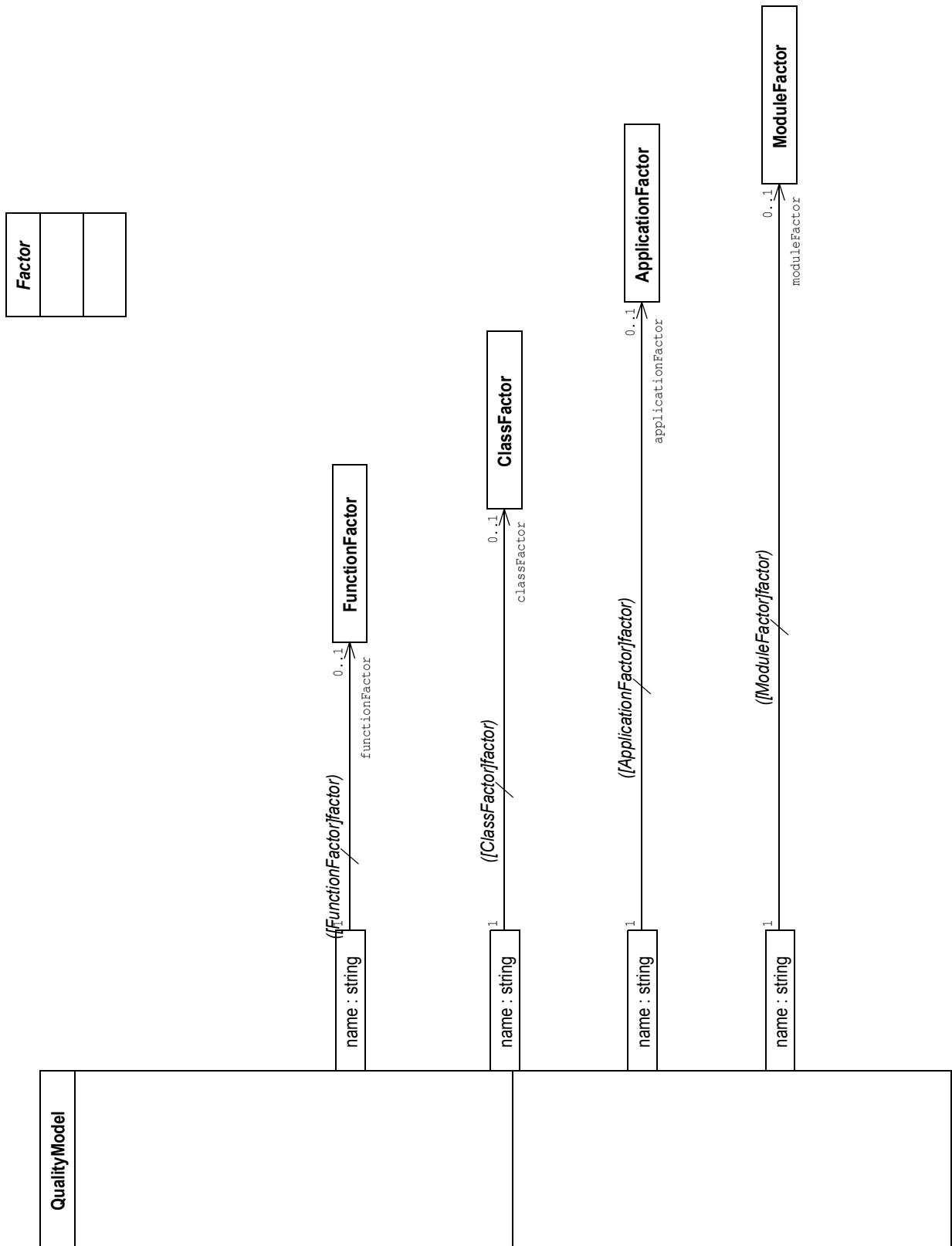


Figure 11 Factor Maps diagram

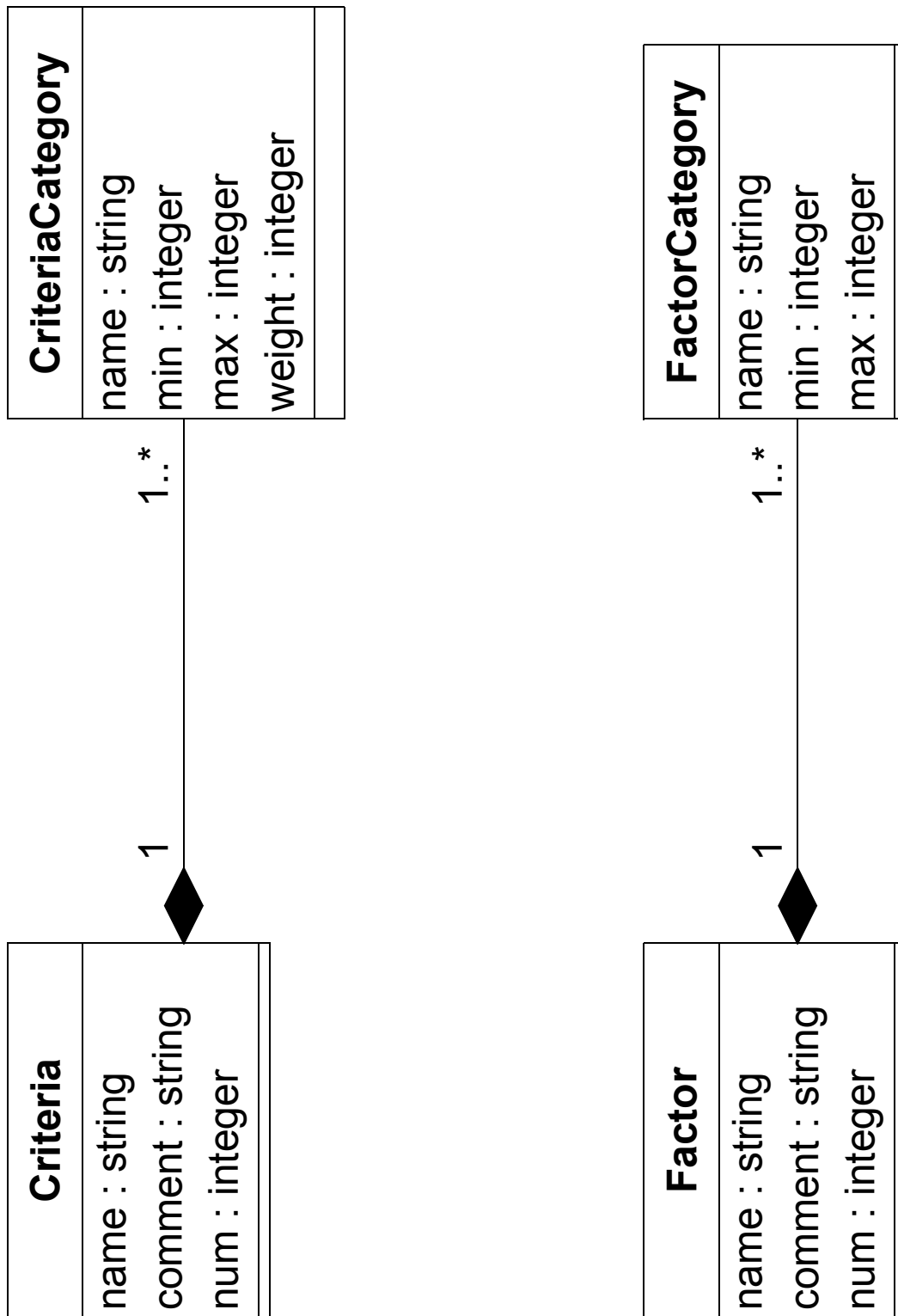


Figure 12 Category diagram

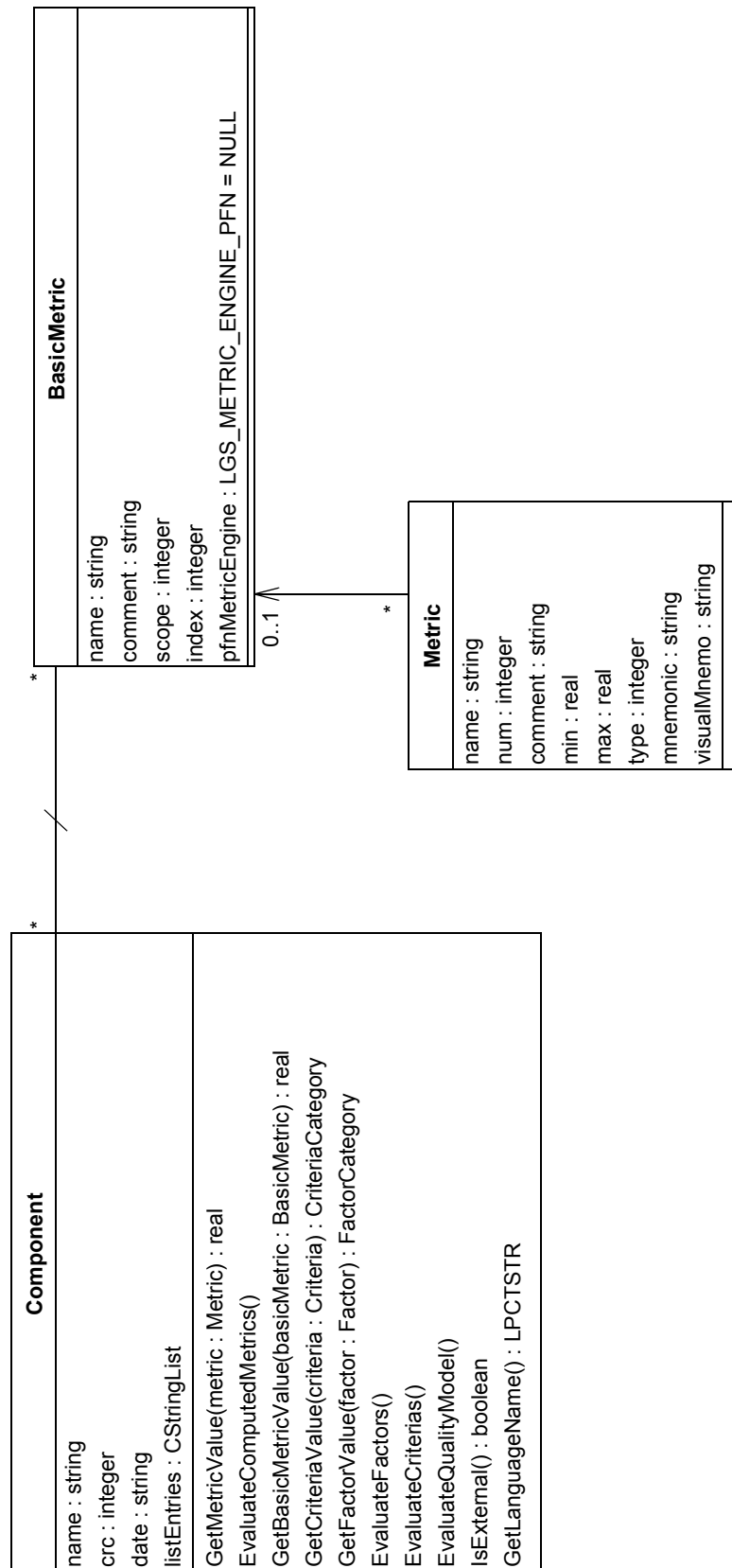


Figure 13 Base Metric diagram

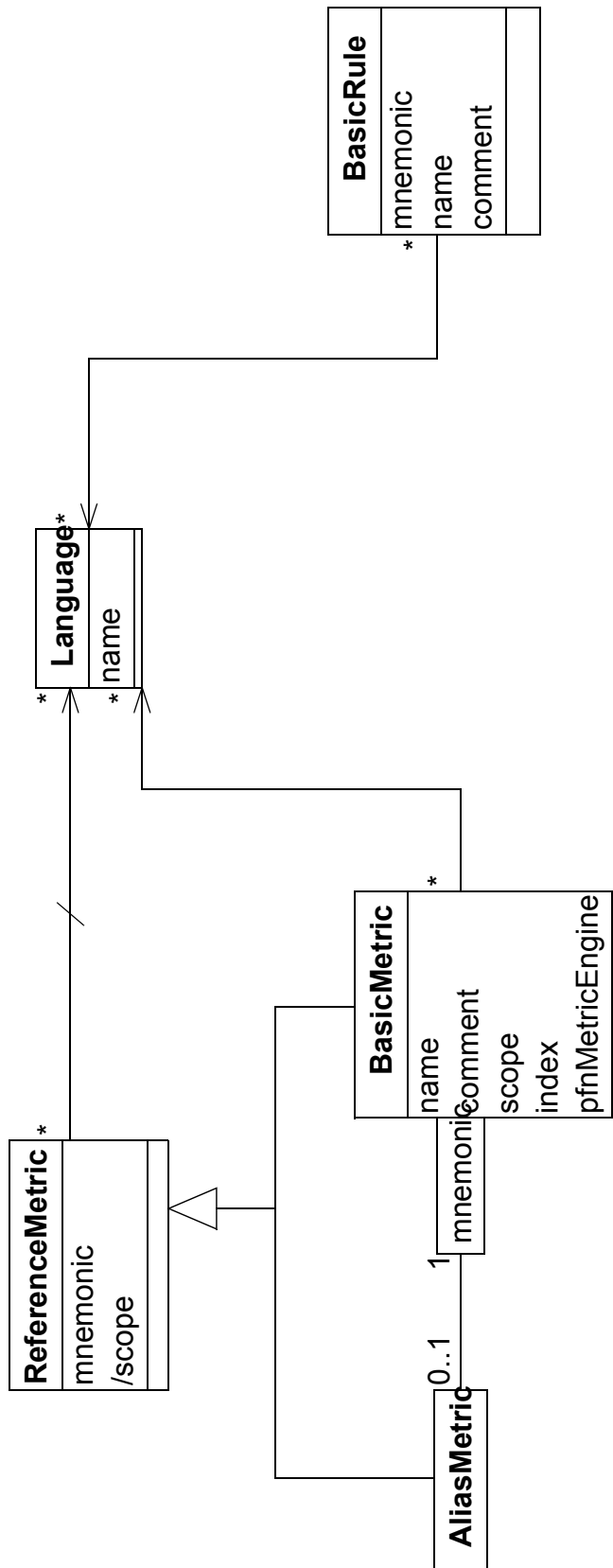


Figure 14 Base Rule diagram

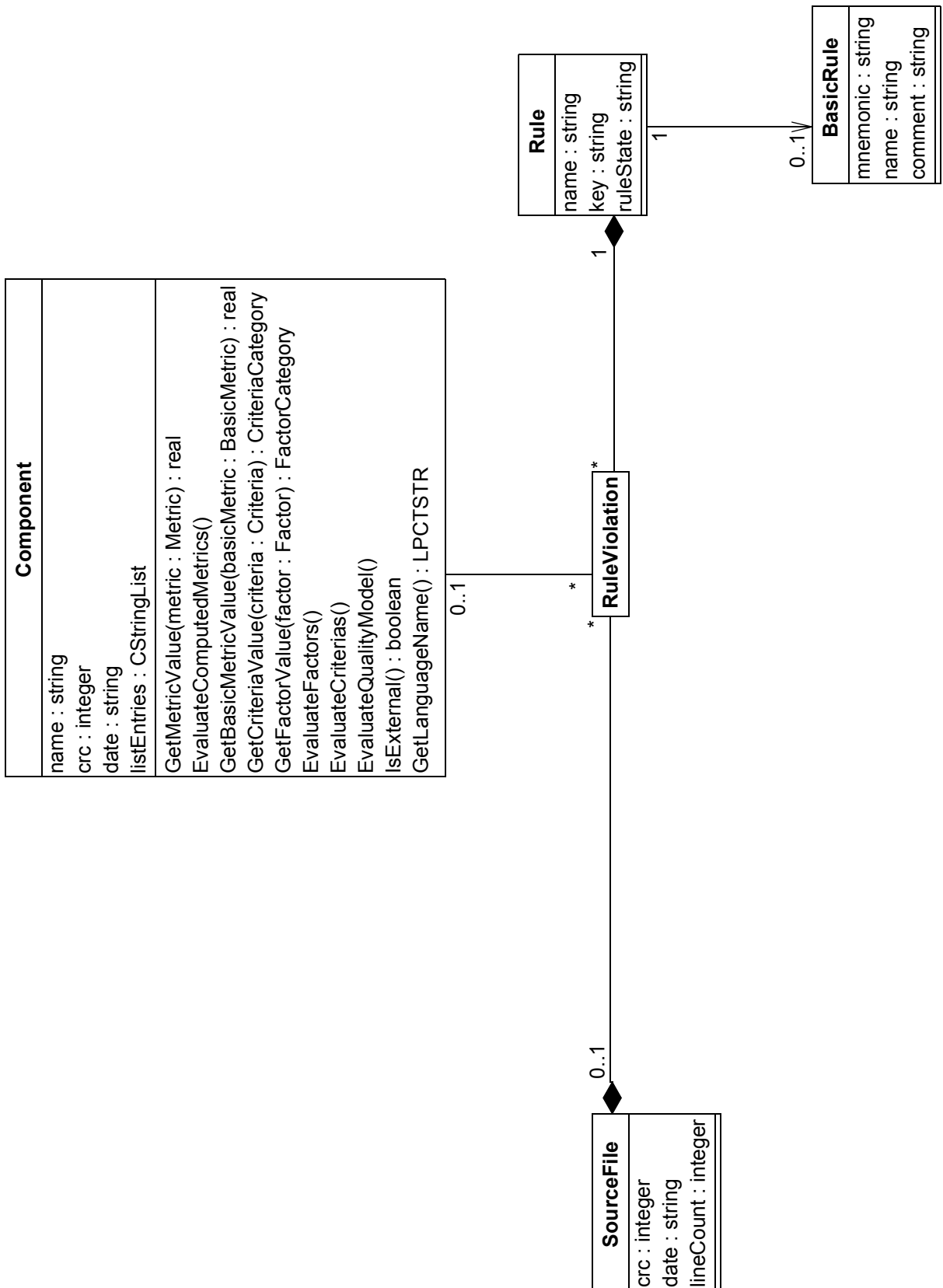


Figure 15 Programming Rules diagram

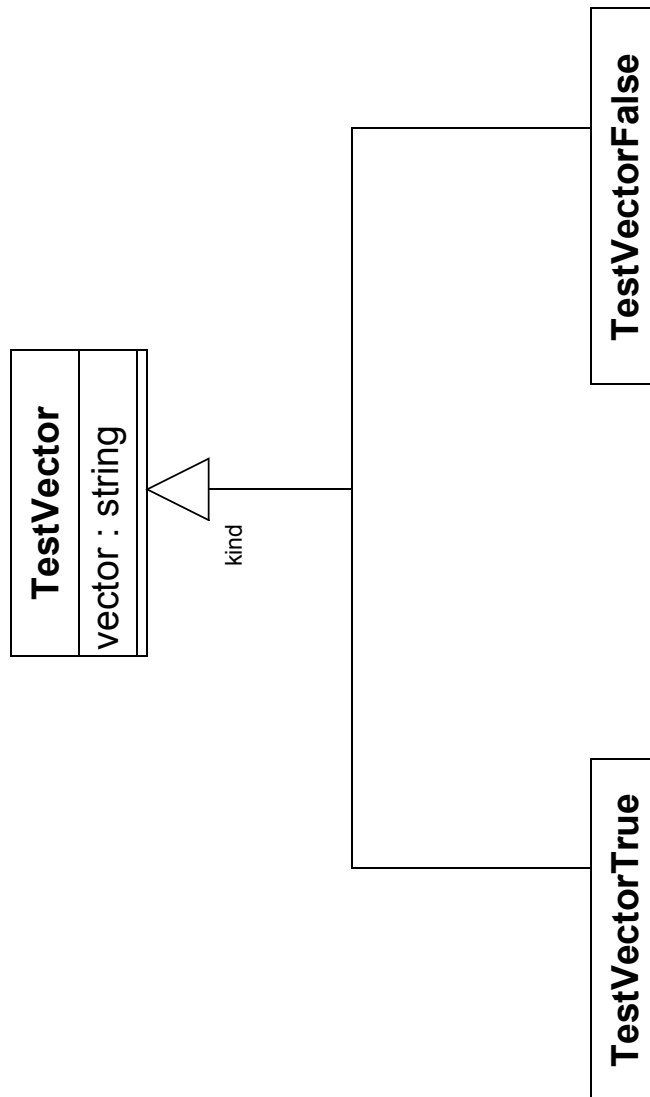


Figure 16 Test Vector diagram

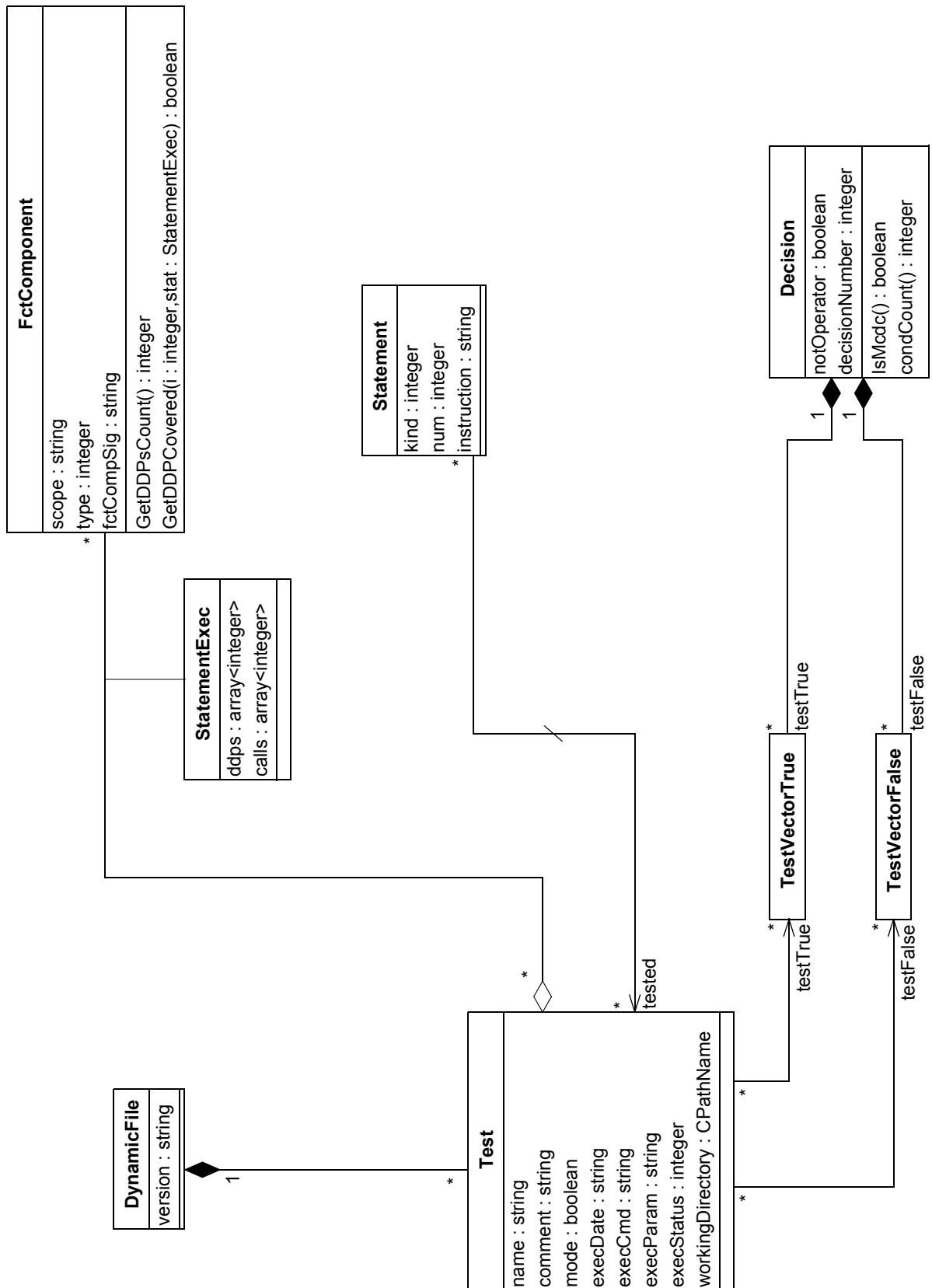


Figure 17 Dynamic diagram

It scans objects associated with the *source_object* which have *target_role* as a role.

For each object which is the *target_role* in one of the associations of *source_object*, the *fscript* command sequence is evaluated:

- if *fscript* returns a value greater than 0, the *script* sequence is evaluated,
- if *fscript* returns a value equal to 0, the *script* sequence is not evaluated.

If *fscript* is not present, *script* is always evaluated.

If *script* returns a value equal to 0, the *MapRole* command stops immediately.

At each evaluation, *fscript* and *script* receive as a parameter the identifier of the object to process.

The *MapRole* command returns the number of times *script* has been evaluated. This number represents the overall number of objects which have *target_role* as a role in one of the associations of *source_object* or, if a filter is specified, it represents the number of

objects that match the filtering condition. An error is reported:

- if *source_object* has no association with, as a role, a target object: *target_role*,
- if *fscript* and *script* end with an uncontrolled value.

Appendix B

Using Logiscope on UNIX

This appendix presents some UNIX specific behaviors and utilities.

B.1 Printer Settings

You can easily add a new printer or change your default printer through the **mwprinter** utility, which launches a printer applet similar to the Windows printers one.

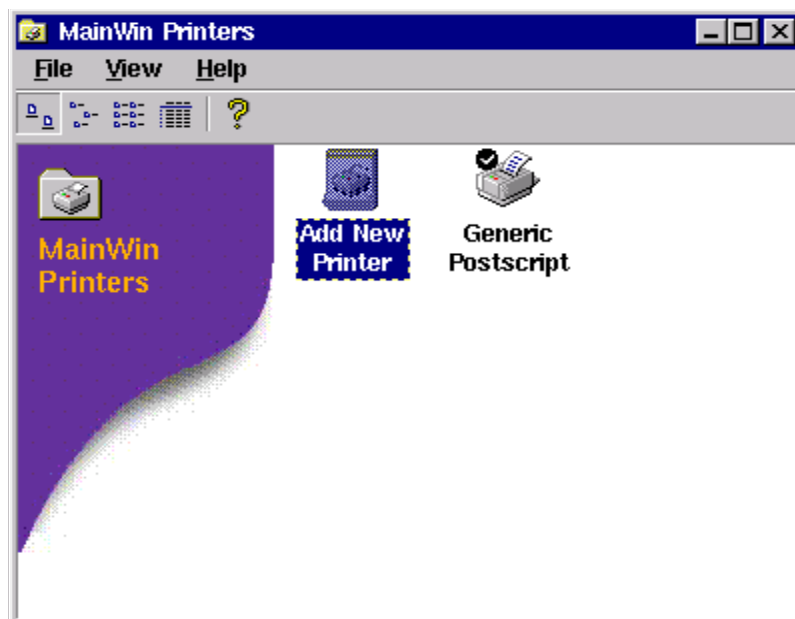
The **Printers** applet includes a default generic postscript printer command mapping that satisfies most printing needs. The **PRINTER** environment variable should be set to your default printer name.

If you need to add other printer command mappings, you can use the **Add Printer** wizard described below.

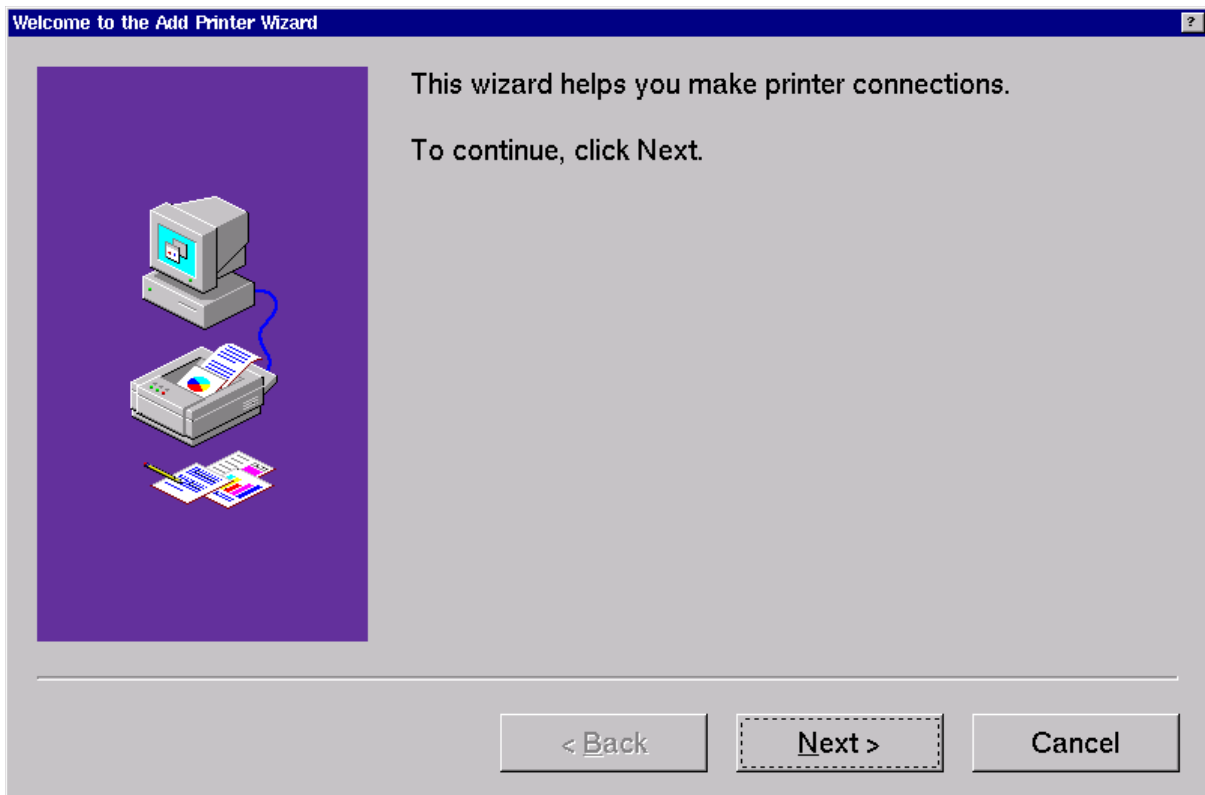
Changes you make using the **Printers** applet have an impact on the applications running on the same machine ; they become effective after saving. Applications running on other machines must be restarted for the changes to be effective.

To add a printer using the **Add Printer** wizard:

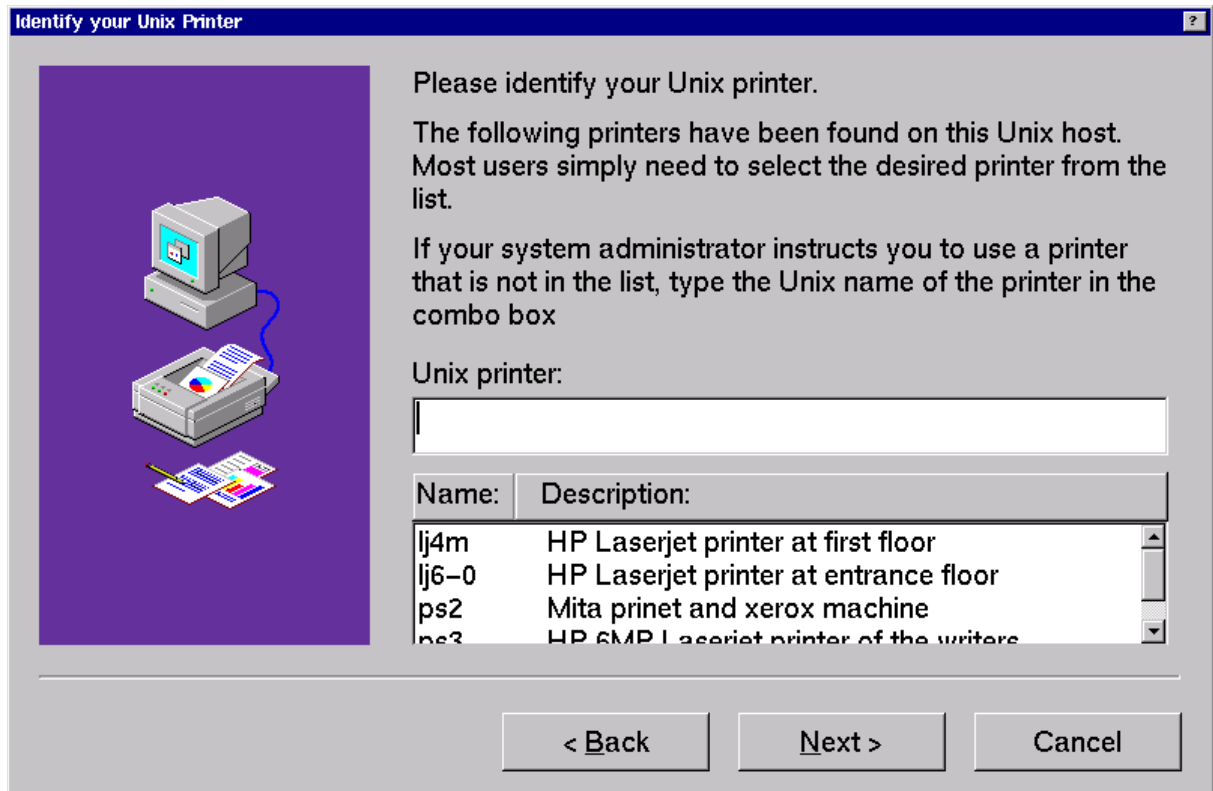
1. Launch the Visual MainWin Control Panel.
2. Double-click **Printers**. The **MainWin Printers** applet opens.



3. Double-click **Add New Printer** in the **MainWin Printers** applet. The **Add Printer Wizard** starts.



4. Click Next.

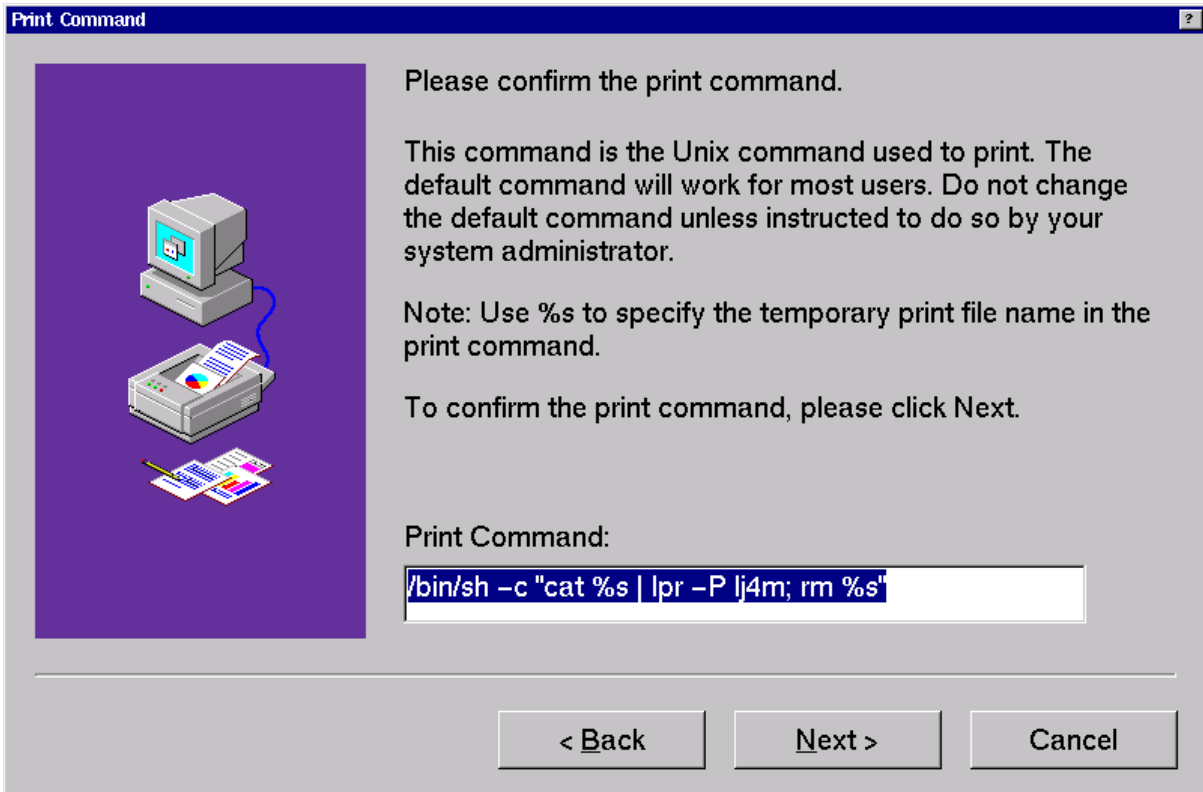


5. Specify the UNIX printer you want to use.

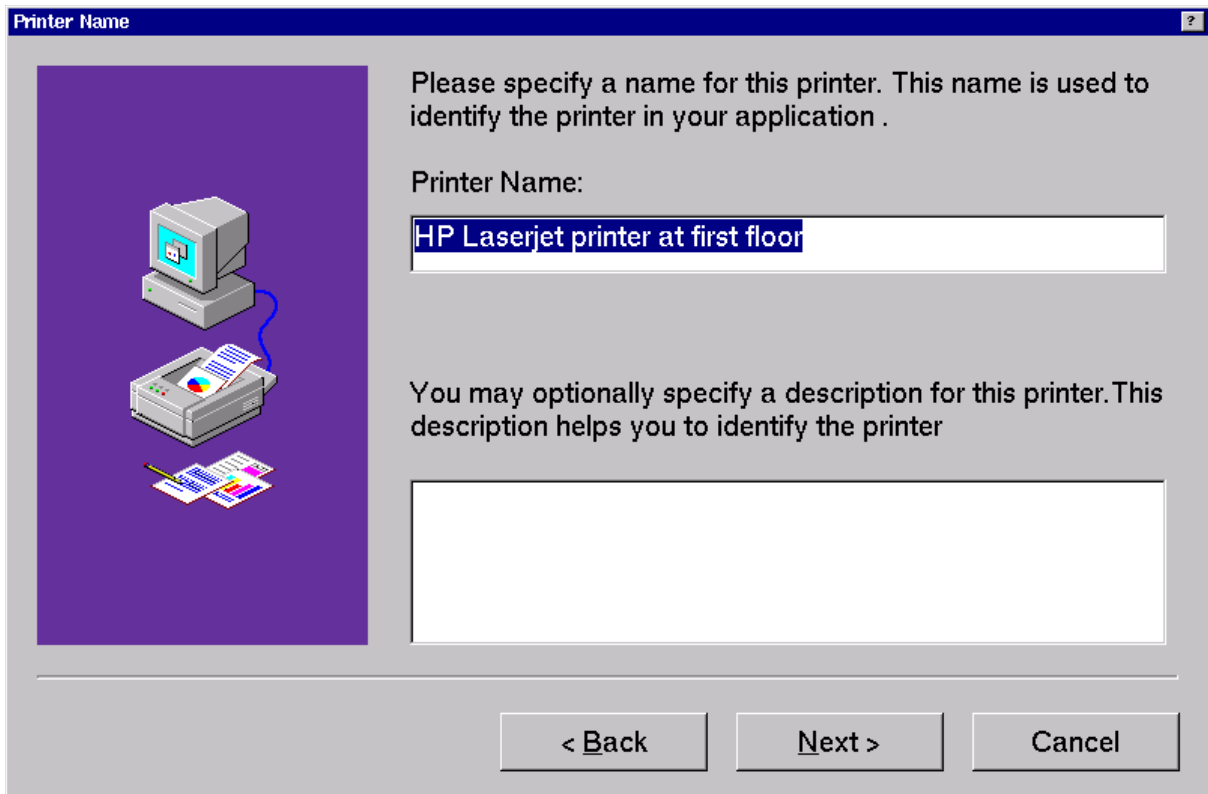
A list of printers defined on the UNIX host appears at the bottom of the wizard. If the printer you want to add is included in the list, select it. To add a printer that is not in the list, enter the UNIX name of the printer in the UNIX printer text field.

Note: The list of printers is extracted from the /etc/printcap file, which contains the list of all printers on the network to which your UNIX host has access. The printcap file is used on all UNIX platforms as the central location for specifying printers. It is configured and maintained by the system administrator.

6. Click **Next**.



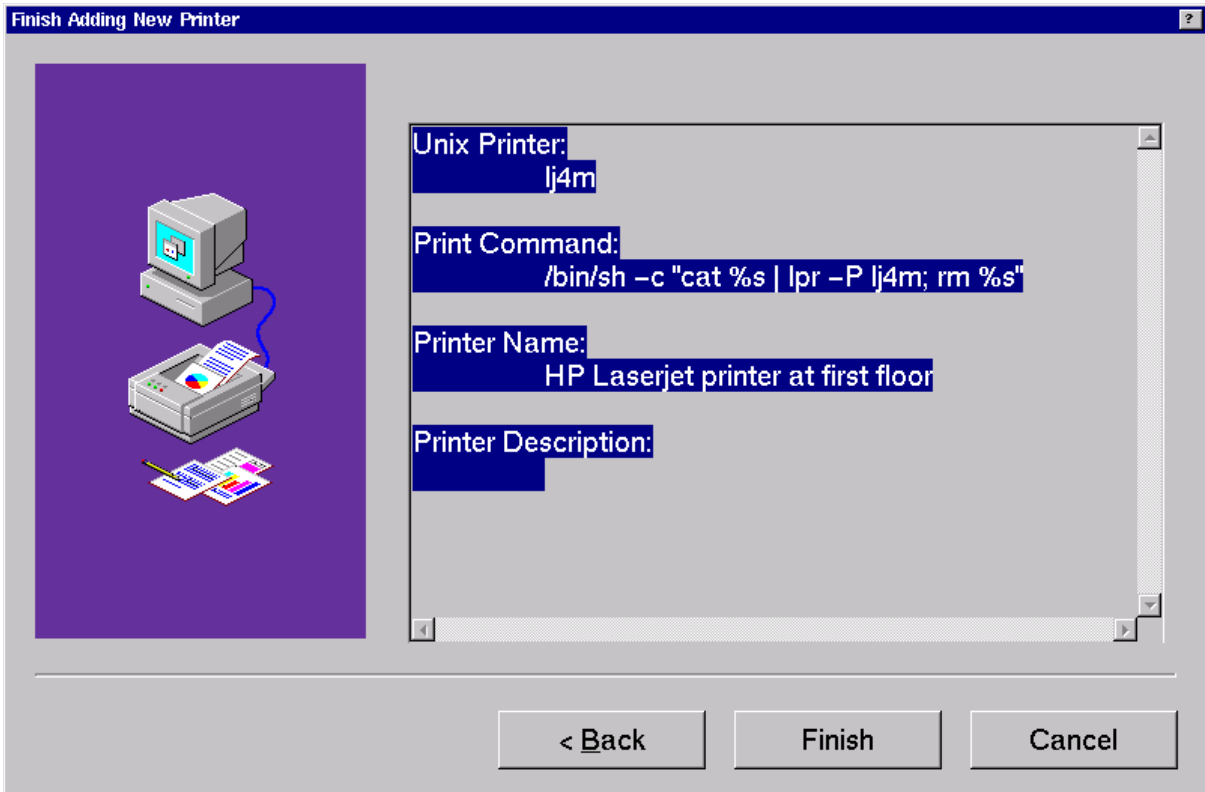
The default print command for the selected printer appears in the **Print Command** text field. Usually, the default command is the one you should use. You should not modify the command unless your system administrator instructs you to do so.

7. Click **Next**.

The **Printer Name** is used by the application when displaying available printers in the **Print** dialog. You may modify the default name if you wish.

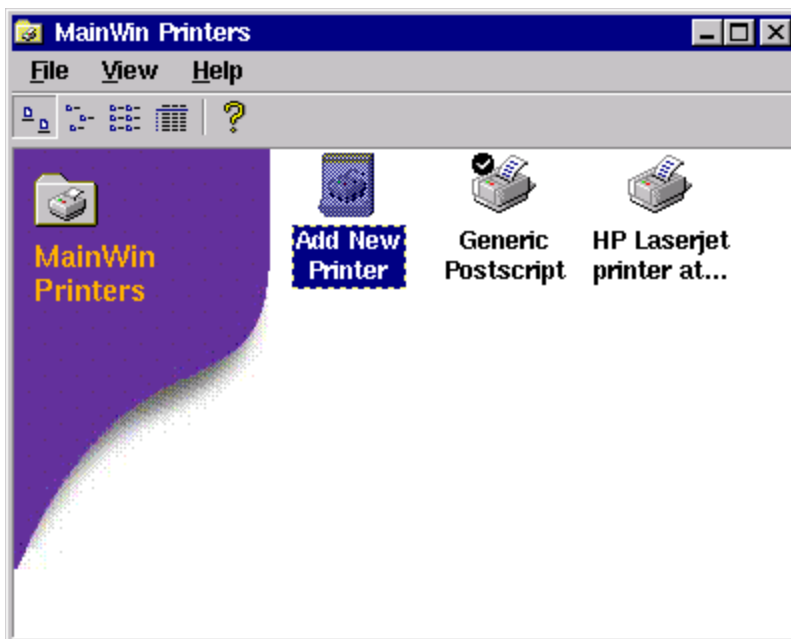
The printer description has the same functionality as on Microsoft Windows. This field may be left blank.
